## Best supermarket strawberries

Which supermarket strawberries are worth buying this summer? We put them to a taste test to find out

rits certainly love strawberries: £375m worth of them were sold in the UK last year. But with larger and hardier strawberries becoming more common, and the British strawberry season now stretched from six weeks to six months thanks to growers' use of polytunnels, will the strawberries you pick up at the supermarket taste any good?

To find out, we asked a panel of 136 consumers to rate strawberries from eight supermarkets: Aldi, Asda, Lidl, Marks & Spencer, Morrisons, Sainsbury's, Tesco and Waitrose. We concentrated on standard strawberries – they're cheaper than organic strawberries, and our previous tests haven't revealed any difference in taste.

Our Best Buys, Marks & Spencer and Waitrose, scored consistently highly on every measure. However, there is one major difference between them: price. Waitrose's strawberries cost a third less than those from Marks & Spencer – the most expensive strawberries we tested.

## Grow or pick your own

#### Home-grown strawberries taste better and will save you money

Growing your own strawberries is enticingly easy if you have a sunny site – even a pot on a balcony will do. Plants cost from 50p to £1.



Twenty plants should vield around 6kg of fruit in their second year saving you about £10 if you were to buy the equivalent amount of Best Buy strawberries.

They'll also taste much better.

## How we test

#### Our testers ate their way through nearly 35kg of strawberries

We tested standard strawberries purchased in May 2009; prices referred to here are those we paid.

We asked 136 consumers to taste six different strawberries - any more would run the risk of confusing their tastebuds - and each of the eight supermarkets'

strawberries was tasted 102 times. The order of the strawberries was varied at random, and no brand could be identified.

Tasters rated the strawberries for appearance, aroma, taste and texture; the averages of these scores determine our star ratings.
