

ettles carrying a famous brand name (and price tag to match) are appearing everywhere these days. However, some seem to have been made for the catwalk only – the £80 Siemens Porsche kettle is heavy and slow, and was easily outperformed by cheaper models from Philips and Breville.

While some designer kettles do well in our tests – the Magimix 11565 is a Best Buy – we've found alternatives that look similar, are also Best Buys and cost far less.

We've looked at a range of products from traditional dome kettles to sleek and sylish models, as well as kettles in different colours.



Using a price comparison website can help you find your chosen kettle for the lowest price. When we checked www.whichcompare.co.uk

for the Breville Blue Ice JK147 we found that John Lewis charged £48.95, but the same kettle costs £39 at Amazon.co.uk.

Traditional dome

The position of the handle can make filling through the top difficult with the Dualit. The Best Buy dome kettles shown can be filled through the spout



Dualit Axis Dome

Which? test score 64%

PROS It's light, boils quickly and has a good energy-efficiency rating.
CONS The limescale filter is poor.
It can only be filled via the lid, which is hard to remove.

Which? test score 74%

PROS The limescale filter works well and is dishwasher-friendly. The kettle is well balanced.

CONS The lid is difficult to remove, but you can fill via the spout instead.

PROS This kettle is well balanced, easy to clean and energy efficient. It boils faster than many other models. CONS The lid is stiff (it's easier to fill through the spout) and the waterlevel markings are very small.

Sleek and stylish Porsche is known for fast cars, but its kettle is slower than the cheaper models we tested. And although it looks great, it's far heavier



Siemens Porsche TW911P2 580

Which? test score 64%

PROS The innovative insulated lid and handle are safe to touch when the kettle's full of boiling water. It's quiet when boiling, easy to clean and comfortable to hold.

CONS It's slow, taking almost three minutes to boil a litre of water. It's heavy (1.2kg) and only holds 1.5 litres.

PROS Energy efficiency for this model is excellent. A one-cup boiling time of 56 seconds makes this the ideal choice if you live on your own. **CONS** Once water is boiled it takes six seconds before the auto switch-off kicks in. Cleaning can

PROS This Breville is quick, boiling a litre of water in just 2 minutes 22 seconds. It's easy to fill through the spout or by opening the lid with the automatic release.

CONS This kettle is noisier than most, and our testers found the limescale filter awkward to remove.

PROS This Best Buy boils a litre of water in 2 minutes 22 seconds and is available with a red, charcoal or cream handle.

CONS It's very heavy – 3.28kg when full. The mirror-finished stainless steel shows finger marks easily.

Breville Colour Select VKJ099 £59

Which? test score 56%

PROS Translucent panels in the kettle's top and handle glow in the colour of your choice when it's in standby mode. Options include blue, red, orange, yellow and purple. CONS It takes 11 seconds for the automatic switch-off to kick in. It's noisy and the limescale filter is poor.

PROS The blue illuminated handle and power switch give this kettle a hi-tech look. It's one of the most energy-efficient models we've tested and boils quickly.

CONS Noisy boiling and a poor limescale filter are the only things that let this kettle down.
