Unfair for motorists

Fines for motoring offences now seem to be part of everyday life. Home Office statistics show that 13.5 million such offences were committed in 2004 – with nearly half of all vehicles in the UK having been 'guilty' in one way or another.

This month we highlight one example of how these fines are often dished out unfairly, reporting on a council that has netted more than $\pounds 1$ million in penalties because its signs were badly sited and confusingly worded (p7).

This adds to the cases that you've told us about in your hundreds – from parking fine scams to illegal clamping. With our use of four wheels showing no sign of slowing down, we'll undoubtedly see more and more measures introduced to restrict car use and to keep traffic moving.

But for these to be acceptable, they must be fairly and legally applied – and focused on managing traffic, not raising cash. Judging by the number of cases you've sent us, and the rising anger that you display, we seem to be a long way from that.
