Our poor lab staff subjected themselves to four weeks of vibrating offices as they ran appliances to check how long they last. The noise of 51 food processors running simultaneously was so ear-splitting that you could hear it from outside the building.

A hoard of robotic fingers steadily pressed the switches – they turned the models on test on and off up to as many as 750 times.

Meanwhile, our testers put the processors through their paces in up to 15 different food tests. They checked the results of chopping, grinding, grating and blending in the machines.
