Satnav systems are changing, and so is our testing – we pick three Best Buys and rate nine more models you'll find in the shops this Christmas

echnology has moved on since Which? began testing satnavs in 2006. While early models could not warn you about traffic jams you were heading for – and the worst could lead you over a cliff edge – most modern models stream up-to-date information and guide you round congestion with ease.

Now that even the worst models are streets ahead, we have updated and improved our testing to pinpoint the very best satnavs for your money.

Our latest research methods tell us which are the most versatile and efficient units for coping with modern roads, and which are the simplest to use and the best at getting you to your destination.

These reviews sit alongside our existing results for almost 100 models, which were tested using our previous criteria. All the ratings are still valid, although you cannot draw direct comparisons between them and the latest batch.

As we went to press, we were testing the very latest satnav technology in the form of smart phones with satnav WHICH.CO.UK Don't get let down en route – see our test of tyre gauges and pumps www.which.co.uk/ tyregauges applications installed. Meanwhile, if you're holidaying in the UK this festive season, and have no plans to drive overseas in future, save money by choosing a satnav that doesn't include European mapping.

For example, the Garmin Nüvi 1310 costs £160 compared with the Garmin Nüvi 1490T at £290 – it has many similar functions and performance is almost as good, but the 1310 costs £130 less, as it does not have European maps.

How we test

We test aftermarket 'plug-and-play' satnav systems, which should be ready to use straight from the box.

We use the satnavs on a variety of roads and journeys – a test driver and an observer record the outcome of each test.

Each satnav is fitted according to the maker's instructions. We record how quick it is to install and how simple it is to use – including programming routes, changing a route and following the audio and on-screen instructions.

We always check each model against the manufacturer's claims for features, and our new test considers features in more detail than before – highlighting those that improve ease of use and promote safer travelling, including touch-sensitive screens, voice recognition and the precise nature of directions.

Performance

Accuracy of route mapping We test accuracy of route mapping to several fixed destinations, and the speed of re-routing when we

take a wrong turn. **Clarity of visual instructions** We rate how clearly the map graphics and supporting screen icons indicate the recommended route.

Quality of audio instructions

We assess how clearly the satnav 'voice' explains the instructions and we also listen for hiss and interference in the sound quality of the system.

Versatility

Features We rate critical features, such as the display, connections, mounting brackets, charging accessories and whether it includes options like memory card, bluetooth and voice recognition.

Routing We assess the different methods available for selecting the destination, route calculation settings and whether the system allows the user to avoid particular types of roads, like toll roads, dirt tracks or tunnels, or roads with a specified speed or weight restriction.

Display Here we consider how versatile the satnav is in providing selectable views, how it displays time and distance, the quality of basic mapping and the 'schematic view' (graphical view of the next instruction). We also assess how well it deals with points of interest and if they are easily searchable.
