

How we test



We test how MP3 and MP4 players stand up to bumps

Durability

We place each player in a rotating drum so that it falls 50cm about 20 times while going through a playlist of nearly 100 songs. After 450 turns of the drum, we rate how well the player has continued to play music while being bumped about. This is particularly challenging for hard-disk models, which have to continually access the hard drive. Worst on test was the Mpio HD400.

Damage to hearing

People who constantly listen to personal music players risk damaging their hearing. We check the maximum volume to test for possible damage caused by listening at a high level for more than an hour a day. All models tested exceeded the average limit set by the Health and Safety Executive. Maximum volumes varied from 87 to more than 100dB. All the one-star players in our tests reached more than 99dB, the level that can damage hearing. Worst on test was the iAudio U3 MP4 player at 113dB.

Headphones

Which should you choose?

Almost all our MP3 and MP4 players (p44) would benefit from Best Buy headphones. These include: over-ear: Beyerdynamic DTX900 (£59), Bose Triport (£120); on-ear: Grado SR60 (£79), Sennheiser PX 100 (£30).

On the move



Our ten-page special looks at the best new machines for listening to music or watching video while you're out and about

Imagine being able to download music free (and legally) from the internet. A website called SpiralFrog, which launches in the US next month, offers users the chance to do exactly that.

Music companies such as Vivendi Universal, which includes artists such as Elton John and Girls Aloud, have already agreed that their music catalogue will be put on the site, which will be paid for by advertising.

There is no news on when UK customers will get access, but in the meantime you can use paid-for sites such as *Computing Which?* favourites iTunes (www.itunes.co.uk) and Napster (www.napster.co.uk). You won't be short of choice. There are more than 25 million music tracks available online –

MP3 players aren't just for music. You can also listen to talking books, walking tours and gallery guides or download free podcasts (check your favourite radio station or the BBC website).

We have chosen our Best Buy MP3 players based on which have the best sound quality and are the easiest to use, including the software to organise your music. It is often possible to upgrade the software (also known as firmware) that comes supplied with the machine. You can go to the manufacturer's website to download the latest version for free.

Newer versions let you listen to more file formats, or fix problems from earlier software releases.

What you should look for

CONNECTIONS

Few players come with a docking station, but it's a handy extra. When you sit your player in it, your PC links with the player and updates your music

ACCESSORIES SUPPLIED

Some players come with a belt clip, neck strap or arm band, which are helpful for carrying the player on the go and especially if you are exercising

REMOTE CONTROL

Remote controls on headphone cables are rare but allow you to use the player without taking it out of your pocket

CLOCK

Many players have a clock and alarm – so that's one thing less to pack when you go on holiday



iPod: from icon to also-ran

Why the style leader is now in the chasing pack

Apple's iPod is the most famous MP3 player and an icon of our times. Once it was a Best Buy for its great sound quality and ease of use, with its ingenious scroll wheel. But it's no longer a trailblazer. Other players match its performance and better its mediocre battery life of 17 hours a charge. The iAudio X5L runs for 30 hours, the Archos AV 700 for 41 hours. The iAudio X5L plays videos on a single charge for longer than the iPod can play music. While the iPod battery life is now below average for its memory size, the Nano is still average in this area, which means that, combined with its other qualities, it remains a Best Buy. Apple has revamped its MP3 range, with an all-new Shuffle, new Nanos and iPods with bigger memories and brighter screens. We're testing these.

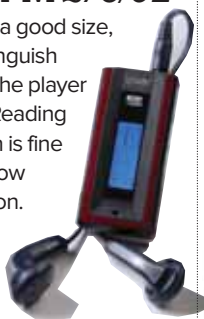

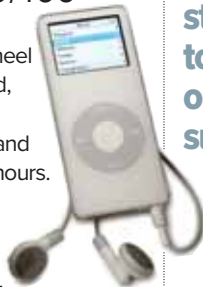

Insider information

Our MP3 player expert Sandie Mattioli gives you the lowdown on a new release from Microsoft which is set to challenge the iPod's dominance

Apple dominates the portable music player market, with iPods, Nanos and Shuffles making up more than half of the digital music players sold worldwide. But how long will the dominance last?

Microsoft is developing a

portable player under the name Zune to take on Apple's iPod. It will be released in the US in time for Christmas. Rivals to Apple's hugely successful music player are of course nothing new, but few have the clout to match a Microsoft-backed player.

Microsoft has said that Zune will have a 30GB hard drive, a three-inch colour screen and a radio, and will come in three

colours – black, white and brown. It will also have Wi-Fi which will let the player connect wirelessly to the internet, allowing users to download music/video directly to it. The wireless capability will also mean nearby users can share music and photos without a PC.

Following a deal between Microsoft and music company EMI, the Zune player will come preloaded with music videos. And Microsoft is preparing to launch a music store to go with the player called Zune Marketplace, where you can buy songs individually or sign up to a subscription service.

The player will be made by Toshiba, and the team behind the Xbox is working on it, but it remains to be seen whether Microsoft can create a player with the same level of cachet that Apple has with the iPod.

Facts & scores

Here are some interesting snippets that we uncovered during our testing

Online music

This iRiver is the only player in this batch compatible with Napster to Go, which uses a special type of WMA with DRM file format.

Hold function

This Ministry of Sound player lacks a hold function. Setting such a function ensures that you don't click any buttons by mistake.

Universal player

The Apple model is compatible with the most music formats of machines on test: MP3, M4A, M4P, Apple lossless, WAV and Audible talking books.

Headphones

These Philips models have plug-style headphones that pop inside your ear. They're not comfortable for everyone, so before buying, try out a pair to ensure they suit the shape of your ear.

Which should you choose?

Best for children

MAXFIELD MAX-JOY £100 ONLINE Aimed specifically at children, the Maxfield (12) has large on-ear headphones and low maximum volume so they won't damage hearing.

Best for battery life

MOBIBLU B153 £99 (1GB)/£129 (2GB) We listened to an astounding 154 hours of music on the Mobiblu (13) with the rechargeable batteries. Its closest rival managed only 48 hours.

Best for quick charging

SONY NWE002 £60 Thirty minutes gives the Sony (11) a full charge of 26 hours, or you can charge it in smaller bursts: five minutes' charging lasts an hour or two.

Best for talking books

SANDISK SANSA c140 £38 The Sansa (10) is compatible with Audible talking books. You'll find more than 30,000 titles at the American site www.audible.com, although they cost £13 each (less if you're a member).

Moving pictures

MP4 players let you watch video on the move. But how good is the picture quality and where can you get content from?

The main selling point of MP4 players compared with MP3s is that they play video. Their abilities do vary, though, with some good enough to watch only video clips while you can comfortably watch full-length films on others.

Unlike portable DVD players (see p48), MP4 players use computer files so are generally smaller and more portable. DVD players can only be as small as the size of a DVD disc. However, the screen on an MP4 may be less suitable for long periods of viewing. The Archos AV700 has a big screen (1.6x9cm), but players with screens of a couple of square centimetres don't do well on test – as they're too small to be able to watch video properly.

Although many MP4 players and portable DVD models can play music, MP4s will often have more features, such as a radio, and even a microphone, a clock and an alarm.

You can watch everything from video clips to full films, but where can you get content from? Apple's iTunes is one of the few music download sites that also sells video content. Apple, which already controls more than 75 per cent of the music-download industry, recently announced the launch of a movie store in the US.

Rumours suggested that the company was in negotiation with most of Hollywood's big studios to make feature films available to download from iTunes. However, as *Which?* went to press, the only confirmed name was Disney films.

There are UK sites, such as Lovefilm, which sell films via download but no news as to when UK shoppers will be able to buy films from iTunes.

To give you an idea of how many films you can store, a 20GB MP4 player would be able to hold up to 180 hours of video footage.

Facts & scores

We take a view on some of the best and worst aspects of the players

Sharing a film

This MPMan has two headphone jacks and comes with two sets of headphones so a couple can enjoy a film together.

Watching video

This iAudio boasts the best battery life when watching video at 18 hours but it also takes the longest to charge, at six hours.

A heavy load

This Archos is the heaviest player on test by a long way. The large screen is ideal if you want to watch a lot of video, but it isn't very portable.

Recording video

These Archos and iAudio models are the best of the few machines that can record video, including from the TV.

If you want music on call

Could one single device really allow you to make phone calls, take pictures, play music and even organise your life? We have a look at what's available

Tired of heavy pockets full of a phone, music player, personal organiser and your camera? Are you waiting for one device that does everything?

Mobile phones purporting to compete with dedicated MP3 players are already here. And playing music isn't the only string to their bow; you can also view photos, watch video, play games and take photos. Our usual mobile phones test includes a test of the music player. We have,

however, also put a few phones (shown here) through the same full test as music players, to see how they compare. The Nokia N91 and Sony Ericsson models are good music players but don't match our MP3 player Best Buys (p40). We can't make them Best Buys but we give details below. The new generation Sony Walkman phones (W700i and W300i) are Best Buy phones. See next month's mobile phones report.

When used as a music player, the sound quality of the Nokia N1 with the supplied headphones is good.

It's easy to load music on to it compared with other phones, but uploading 100MB of music takes nearly two minutes

– this is a long time compared with a dedicated MP3 player but better than other music phones.

The Nokia N91's 4GB memory dwarfs the offerings from other music phones but you won't be able to add more memory to this.

WE LIKE It's compatible with more music formats (MP3, AAC, AAC+ and WMA) than the other phones on test.



The 4GB memory of the Nokia N91 dwarfs that of other mobiles but you can't add more

62% Sony Ericsson

W810i £270

Both Sony Ericsson Walkman phones are good music players, nearly matching the Nokia. Sound quality with the supplied headphones is decent for both phones, but slightly better on the W810i.

Both of these models have better battery life than the Nokia, but you will find that it does take longer to load music on to them. It's compatible with MP3 and AAC +music formats.

WORTH KNOWING You can add memory to this model with an MS Duo memory card. The 810i comes with 256MB compared with 4GB for the Nokia.



62% Sony Ericsson

W900i £390

This model is quite similar to the W810i, left. It also has reasonable sound quality through the headphones that come with it, though the Nokia's is better. It is also not quite as good as the W810i's. The sound is improved by using Best Buy headphones. Both Sony Ericssons have better battery life than the Nokia but it takes longer to load music on to them.

It's compatible with MP3, AAC and AAC+ music formats.

WORTH KNOWING Like the W810i, you can add memory with an MS Duo memory card. The 900i comes with 512MB compared with the Nokia's 4GB.



How we test

Much of our testing of portable DVD players goes into checking picture and sound quality

Picture quality

We use a special test disc to see how the players cope with fast-action pictures such as car chases or explosions, compared with a high-quality TV. A panel of experienced viewers also rates the picture quality watching scenes from *Mars Attacks!* and *Terminator 2*. They give more than 180 ratings while assessing picture resolution and how accurate the colours look.

Sounds good?

We check the quality of stereo and movie sound. Our experts take more than 100 measurements on whether everything from whispering voices to helicopters sound real. Our testers also assess films and audio CDs on the players, listening for good, well-distributed sound with no unwanted background noise.

Sound quality with the headphones supplied is variable but all players sound excellent with Best Buy headphones. The exception is the Wharfedale player, which is not as good as the other models on test.

Ideal for a long train journey

Picture quality is what really sets our Best Buy portable DVD players apart from the other models on test

A portable DVD player, particularly one with a carrying bag, such as our Toshiba Best Buy, could be just the thing for a train journey. A player with a kit that lets you mount it in the car, such as the Panasonic DVDLS91 or Wharfedale WDP-1210, might do the trick if you are taking the children on a long drive and want to keep them occupied. All the players are supplied with adaptors so that you can use them in your car.

Picture quality distinguishes our Best Buys from the rest of the players on test, but what to watch? You can rent films from your local video shop or borrow them from the library. You can also use online movie rental services.

Some portable players come with a kit that lets you mount them in the car

There are lots to choose from and monthly fees range from £10 to £15, depending on how many films you want to rent at once.

Most sites will offer you a free trial so you could try several before handing over any money.

All the sites are easy to use, but there are big differences in the range of films that they have.

What you should look for

SCREEN ANGLE

You choose the viewing angle for most players by adjusting the screen from 90 to 180 degrees. Some offer more flexibility



BATTERY

Some portable DVD players have the battery integrated in the player, like a laptop. Others have a battery pack that sticks out the back of the player



LISTENING

The loudspeakers on most players are generally poor. Although acceptable for watching a film, they're not good enough for listening to music

HEADPHONES

Several players have two headphone jacks allowing two people to listen without disturbing others. Only the Ferguson LDVD81 (5) has two sets of headphones – some players don't even come with one set



Facts & scores

Here are useful extra points on the players

Memory card

This Toshiba has a memory card slot which lets you view films from the memory card.

Resume

The Panasonic, the Hitachi and Wharfedale players all have a resume feature so if you turn the player off mid-movie it will remember your place on the disc.

71% Toshiba SD-P2800SE £240

This Toshiba has a good clear picture for both movies and still images. Sound quality with the supplied headphones is good but it can be improved slightly with a Best Buy set.

It has the best loudspeaker sound of the models on test. You can hear some whirring noise from the drive, though. It's not the most portable player we've tested, as it is heavy and quite thick when the screen is folded down.

WORTH KNOWING This is the most power-hungry model we tested when plugged into the mains.

One of the smallest and most portable players we've tested, it has good picture quality for movies. It is OK for stills, too, but the picture is a little jittery at the top. No headphones are supplied but excellent sound quality is possible with Best Buy headphones. As with most other players on test, the sound quality from the built-in speakers is poor and the drive is quite noisy. The PET 720 is easy to use and a remote control is supplied.

This model is available at Argos and Currys.

WE LIKE This player has the best battery life of all the models on test, at five hours 25 minutes.

Don't Buy

This Matsui (10) struggles to get the basics right; both picture quality and sound quality with the supplied headphones are poor.

It isn't the easiest player to use and several functions are possible only when using the supplied remote control. With such a small device that you sit so near to, it would be better to have more controls on the player itself.

Battery life is one of the shortest of all the models on test and, annoyingly, charging time is longer than playing time.
