# Cinema sound in a box

We've tested all-in-one home-cinema kits so you can reproduce cinema-style sound at home

When you go to the cinema to see the latest action film, you expect to feel like you're in the thick of the action. Speakers placed around the cinema help create this experience. These speakers also use sophisticated digital sound processing to create the surround-sound effect. A home-cinema system tries to re-create this experience in your living room.

If you just want to enjoy surround sound when you watch films at home, the cheapest and simplest option is to buy an all-in-one home-cinema kit. If you want more flexibility, so you can integrate the system with your stereo, you can select home-cinema separates. See our test results for these on p48.

The main elements of any surroundsound system are the speakers and the amplifier. When bought as a kit, a DVD player is often included. We've tested a selection of kits with and without DVD players. In addition to the kit, you'll also need a television or projector and a couple of spare mains sockets.

Your next decision is the number of speakers you need in your kit. The most common choice is five speakers and a subwoofer – called a 5.1 system – but you can opt for fewer speakers. With fewer speakers you compromise on surroundsound effect but they'll take up less room. See 'Jargon buster', p46, for more details.

If you just want to experience surround sound, the simplest option is an all-in-one kit





This is the only Best Buy kit without a DVD player. The surround effect is excellent, making you feel as if you are really there. Stereo sound is not as good, sounding a little flat, but surround sound is better. The subwoofer (see 'Facts & scores', p46) pumps out strong and definite sound. This Denon kit has lots of slots for connections, so you can connect your hi-fi to it. It isn't the easiest system to set up partly because no menu is displayed on the TV. You have to do



this on the screen of the unit itself. This kit is available online.

WE LIKE The large, well laid-out remote control. The buttons are in different colours and shapes which makes it easy to use. Essential buttons for your DVD player are luminous, so you can find them in the dark.

# How we test

Sound quality is key for a home-cinema system. We test three aspects of the systems' sound capabilities

### **Stereo sound**

We listen to rock and pop tracks from Michael Jackson to ZZ Top, and classical and orchestral music by Bruckner and Handel to check which systems deliver good stereo sound. In total we try the systems with 23 pieces of music. Pink Floyd's 'Another Brick in the Wall' is a stern test for all the systems.

### **Surround quality**

Next we step up the testing to see how the systems handle surround sound by watching clips



from films including *The Matrix* and *Jumanji*, as well as live concert footage. We're looking for all the elements to work well – bass from the subwoofer (see picture above), treble, voices – and for none to be overpowering or unduly weak.

### **Surround effect**

Finally we use the same film clips from the test for surroundsound quality to assess the surround-sound effect. We listen carefully for sound effects coming from different parts of the room to see whether the sound is realistic and you feel as if you are in the middle of the action.

This is the best kit with a DVD player. Stereo sound is good, voices sound warm and there is strong bass. Surround sound and picture quality are no slouch either.

This kit is one of the more power-hungry systems in use, although not in standby. It is let down slightly by a complicated remote control. It's available online.

# What you should look for

SPEAKERS Often the speakers are the weakest part of a kit. Those with this Goodmans GHC 57 FM Pro (20) perform badly



All the DVD players delivered good picture quality, but if you already have a DVD player, consider a kit without one, such as the Best Buy Denon DHT-1356XP (1)

#### WIRELESS KITS

You can buy a transmitter to operate speakers wirelessly for some kits. With others, you need completely different speakers. The Pioneer DCS-535 (13) comes with wireless rear speakers

#### CABLES

All the systems come with set lengths of cable for the speakers, except the Jamo A102HCS10 (16), which comes with 35m of cable that you cut as needed

Both classical and pop music sound good with this kit and it handles movie sound well. The DVD player offers great picture quality. Pictures have good colour balance and are accurate with lots of detail, even in complicated scenes when a lot is going on. There is no digital input so you can't upgrade the DVD player or add a Sky set-top box. Both the setup menu and remote control

are logical and easy to navigate. It's one of the least power-hungry systems on test and frugal in standby, too. It's available at Currys. WE LIKE Coloured cables

## **65% Panasonic SC-HT530** £171

This kit matches more expensive Best Buy kits for sound quality and surroundsound effect. It can't be turned up as loud as some of the other kits we've tested, although it should be sufficient for most living rooms. The amplifier comes with an in-built RDS tuner and DVD player. The AM and FM tuner has 15 presets for each band to store your favourite stations. The DVD player works well and picture quality is good. This kit is fairly easy to set up and use, too. The power amplifiers for all the speakers are in the subwoofer cabinet so you plug the cables into this rather than having a spaghetti of wires going into the



#### main unit. It is available online. BEST FOR If you're looking for an introduction to home cinema for not much outlay, this is the kit for you.

### The inside information on home cinema kits

### **Picture quality**

Picture quality from the Yamaha DVX-S250 DVD player is good, as it is for all the systems we've tested. We found that differences between the picture quality of the kits are minimal, although there are differences in slow motion.

### **Sound quality**

There are big differences between the kits when it comes to sound. We listened to 552 pieces of music and watched 192 film clips to judge stereo and surround sound, so we can tell you that this Sony DAV-DZ500S is one of the best at both.

### Subwoofer

More than half the kits have an active subwoofer – that is, the subwoofer has its own amplifier. For some kits, like the Panasonic SC-HT530, this keeps cables away from the unit under the TV because satellite speaker cables can run from the subwoofer.

from behind and three to the front (one to the left of the TV, one to the right and one in the centre as close as possible to the TV). The rear speakers handle much of the higher frequencies, which give the impression that sound is coming from

# difference between 2.1, 5.1 and 7.1 speaker systems?

### used with home-cinema systems and why you might use them

around the room, while the subwoofer kicks out the lower bass frequencies.

2.1 A 2.1 system comprises two front speakers and a subwoofer, and attempts to create surround sound without rear speakers. These systems create a pseudo surround-sound effect with electronic processing, known as Dolby Virtual Surround. 2.1 kits don't give as full a sound. You can see from the table that only one

(Yamaha AVX-S30/DVD-S30) matches our Best Buy 5.1 systems for surround effect. But a 2.1 system does means less clutter and fewer wires.

7.1 A 7.1 system means you can

add an extra amplifier and rear speakers for enhanced surround effects. The Denon DHT-500 SD Best Buy (3) and all the Yamaha amplifiers we tested as separates can take extra speakers. This is for the discerning listener.

# Go your own way

# If you don't want to be tied into a home-cinema kit, you can opt for separates, but they're not cheap

Separates are the ideal choice for the home-cinema enthusiast or someone who is prepared to put in the time to get the best from them.

They tend to cost more than a home-cinema kit but let you mix and match different pieces of equipment. For example, if you are fussy about sound you can choose the exact speakers you want. They also give you more options, such as connecting to your hi-fi. But for the money you have to spend, they certainly don't leave the kits in the dust. The Best Buy Denon DHT-1356XP and Yamaha DVX-S250 kits are as good as our Best Buy separates but are at least £400 cheaper. It also takes more trial and error to get an optimum set-up with a separates system.

If you have lots of other audio and visual equipment in your house and want to add home cinema to it rather than buy a whole new kit, separates are worth considering.



# 70% Yamaha RX-V657 amplifier with Wharfedale Diamond 9 HCP speaker £785

This amplifier and speaker combination produces good sound quality and surround effects but isn't cheap. You get a versatile home-cinema amplifier with outputs to run a 7.1 system. The built-in RDS tuner is up there with the best. This combination delivers decent surround sound with well-distributed sound effects, though no better than the Best Buy kits. Stereo sound is good, although voices can sound dull. It is quite a power-hungry system even in standby, but it is easy to set up with

an excellent trouble-shooting guide. The amplifier is available at Richer Sounds and online. The speakers are available online.

GOOD FOR The back panel sports enough inputs and outputs to hook up just about any other bit of audio equipment you can think of, so if you want, you can link it to your hi-fi system and more.

# How to set up and position

### You need to position and set up the speakers carefully

Once you've unpacked your new system, you may find it daunting. There's a fair bit of equipment to set up, and you'll have to spend a couple of hours installing it to get the best from it.

The home-cinema sound experience varies, depending on where you sit. For the best set-up, we'd ideally all have a square living room with the TV located centrally on one wall and the sofa placed centrally on the opposite side. The front speakers would be either side of the TV, at least a metre away, and the centre speaker below the screen. The rear speakers would be behind the sofa, to the left and right of the main viewer. The best position for the subwoofer is in the middle of the front wall. This is how we set up the kits in our tests.

But few of us have square living rooms. The diagram, right, shows you how you

#### to experience the best sound

can set up a system in a room that isn't the ideal shape and get good results.

#### LOCATING THE SPEAKERS

Put the front speakers to the left and right of the TV, facing the sofa. Place the centre speaker as near to the TV as you can and put the rear speakers in the opposite corners of the room. The subwoofer can go in one of the other corners.

Once you've located the surround speakers and cabled them to the amplifier, program the

system so that it knows how far the speakers are from the viewer using the remote control. This is important for a realistic surroundsound experience because otherwise you'll hear the sound from closer speakers before the sound from the further speakers.

You also need to set the speaker levels so that it sounds as if the speakers are at the same volume. To do this, sit in the main viewing seat and set the system to fire a test tone to each speaker. Adjust the sound levels until they sound



as if they're the same volume. As every room has its own shape and layout, and other furniture that will affect the sound, you'll need to tinker with the position of the speakers or adjust the sound delay and volume levels. If you think all this sounds complicated, you might be tempted by the automatic set-up feature on the Best Buy Yamaha DVX-S250 (p45).
