## How we test



To put the washing machines through their paces, we make the different models wash more than 390 loads

### Rinsing

To measure how well each machine removes detergent during the rinse cycle, we take freshly rinsed washing from the machine and put it in a super-fast dryer that spins at 2800rpm – roughly twice as fast as a typical washing machine. We then collect water from the clothes and measure how alkaline it is compared with the alkalinity of the tap water that was used in the wash. Detergent is alkaline, so the higher the levels in the water, the poorer the machine is at rinsing. In our tests, the Miele 1512 (number 3 in the table, p46), Bosch WBB 24759 Logixx (2) and Siemens WXL147A (5) are the best at rinsing on cotton washes.

## **Disabled users**

Using a unique checklist developed with Ricability, an independent charity for disabled people, we look for any potential difficulties that wheelchair users or those with reduced mobility, vision or dexterity might face. In total, we check more than 160 characteristics on each model this covers loading and unloading the machine, selecting the programs, clarity of the control panel lights, cleaning the filter and adding detergent.

# Full cycle methods we've introduct to help you choose the best washing machine

It's more than 40 years since Which? tested the first automatic washing machines. To mark this anniversary. we've introduced some exciting new testing methods which have enabled us to recommend the washing machines best suited for those with skin allergies, wheelchair users, and people with reduced mobility, vision and dexterity.

For this report, we've tested 26 of the latest washing machines – 22 freestanding and four built-in models – ranging from £240 to £900. Although we can't test every model in the shops, we do know there are some that are very similar to our 12 Best Buys but have, for

example, a faster spin speed. So we've also provided you with the information you need to purchase a machine we are confident will be just as good as one of our Best Buys (see p49).

And because we buy all of the products we test, we go through exactly the same experience you do when you buy a new washing machine. This means we know it can be tricky to find the one you want on the high street – even the largest shops have only a limited number of models in stock. That's why we've also packed this report with buying advice to ensure you can always track down the washing machine that best suits you.

# What you should look for

### CHILD LOCKS

Machines often come with locks that prevent children from interfering with them. Some operate by locking the control panel; for others you'll need to turn a special screw located on the inside of the door

### DETERGENT DRAWER

The Indesit WM12/X built-in model (26) has a novel drawer that swings through 180 degrees. It's an interesting twist on the traditional pullout design and has wide compartments



### TILTED DRUMS

The 9kg drum on the Bosch WBB 24759 Logixx (2), and on other larger-capacity models in the shops, is tilted to help with loading and unloading clothes. We found this worked well

### **SPIN SPEED**

A higher spin speed, such as 1600rpm or 1800rpm, will reduce the time clothes spend on the line or in the dryer. You usually have to pay extra for this feature, and a higher speed can result in more noise

### **QUICK WASH**

One in five Which? members save time by using the guickwash program for every load. On many machines this is suitable for cleaning only small loads between 1kg and 3kg - roughly the difference between washing two pairs and six pairs of jeans

### **DOOR HEIGHT**

The door on the Candy GO147 (14) is 10cm higher than on most other models. It's easier to load and unload as you don't have to bend over so far

This Miele is one of only three machines to get top

marks on both cotton and quick washes. The small 5kg drum might not suit heavy users but it comes with lots of useful programs – including reduced ironing, wool and handwash. The 520 is cheap to run, the filter's easy to reach and empty and Miele provides a free, three-year warranty. It is available from Comet and Currys.

WE FOUND This is the quietest machine during rinsing and spinning.

## 2 FREESTANDING 66% Bosch WBB 24759 Logixx £900

This Bosch's large drum makes it ideal for big families. It's wider and taller than the average machine, so it will require extra space. The drum's tilted upwards so you don't need to bend too far and the wide door opening

makes it easy to load. The Bosch is available from Currys and John Lewis.



WE FOUND Running costs are low but you will need to wash full loads to make the most of this.

## **5 FREESTANDING** 64% Siemens WXL147A £530

The 1400rpm WXL147A outperformed its 1200rpm stablemate in our tests – washing well and excelling at spin drying. Rinsing is better than on most other Best Buys and the quick wash takes just 54 minutes, and Siemens' reliability is good. The 1600rpm WXL167A is also in this range (see p49).

Both are available online. WORTH KNOWING The WXL147A includes an auto-load sensor instead of

a reduced load option.

# **Built-in machines**

### Why built in isn't best

Around 10 per cent of washing machines sold are designed to be built in to a kitchen cabinet. There are fewer to choose from than freestanding models and they tend to be more expensive because they need special parts to prevent noise and vibration. None of the built-in models we tested is a Best Buy, but the AEG-Electrolux L12510Vi (23) washes well and is easy to use.

The AEG-Electrolux L74810 is particularly easy to use and, unlike similar-priced

models, includes a few extra features. Its quick wash produced great results but it doesn't wash cottons as well. Spinning is better than on most other machines and it's cheap to run due to low water and energy use. This range includes the 1600rpm L76810 (see p49). It is available from John Lewis. **WORTH KNOWING This machine automatically adds an extra rinse cycle if you use too much detergent.**

This striking Siemens model is the sister of the WXL147A (5) and boasts one of the shortest quick washes of our Best Buys, at just 51 minutes. Wash results are good for all loads, making it a strong all-rounder. Like many machines, rinsing on the cotton wash is a bit of a letdown. Siemens provides a free five-year warranty and the machine's available

from Currys.



Siemens WXL127A is available only in a graphite finish.

## **62% Tricity Bendix 1260** £240

The Tricity Bendix 1260 is a basic washing machine that lacks extra features, such as a handwash program. However, not everyone wants or needs lots of extra programs and the Tricity cleans well and is easy to use. Rinsing isn't the best, but Tricity Bendix did well in our latest reliability survey – so this model is unlikely to break down. The 1260 is widely available online.

WE FOUND This is one of the few machines you can find available for under £250.

## Keep it in the family How to choose a similar model to our Best Buys

We can't test every machine in the shops but we know there are some models that vary in minor ways to those we've tested. The table, right, contains machines that are virtually identical to our Best Buys and, based on their specification and the results for models within the same family, we'd expect to see a similar level of performance.

For example, the family of the Zanussi-Electrolux ZWF1237 and Zanussi-Electrolux ZWF1437 Best Buys (pictured, above right) also contains the Zanussi-Electrolux ZWF1637. There is little to tell them apart besides a respective 1200rpm, 1400rpm and 1600rpm spin speed.

Other manufacturers, including Bosch, name the families within the range according to specification.



Two Zanussi-Electrolux Best Buys are identical except for their respective spin speeds

A Bosch Classixx model has the lowest specification, for example, and the Exxcel models have more features, whereas a Logixx machine has a higher specification and premium machines, such as the Bosch WBB 24759 Logixx, cost more.

### Checklist

Here's what you need to consider before you buy a similar model:

 Usually similar models have a different spin speed, such as 1600rpm or 1800rpm. To protect delicate clothes during spinning or to reduce noise levels, lower the spin speed.
 Wash times vary according to a model's spin speed.
 Telephone the manufacturer's helpline or check its website to find out how program times differ between the machines.
 Often models within the

Often models within the same family have a slightly different layout for the control panel. Check you are happy with any differences before you buy.

More expensive models tend to come with extra features. The Zanussi-Electrolux ZWV1651S even talks – it calls out program details and information on the wash progress while it cleans your clothes.

The innovative, large-capacity LG comes with a dual-spray steam washing system that uses a combination of water and steam to clean clothes. Our tests revealed that the quick wash is good at cleaning small loads, but the steam-only baby clothes cycle failed to lift

typical heavy-duty stains like puréed carrot. You can buy it from Comet or Currys.

WE FOUND The refresh program makes clothes easier to iron, but it won't remove stubborn creases.

## 13 FREESTANDING 61% Zanussi-Electrolux ZWF1437W/S £330

There is little to choose between this model and the Best Buy 1200rpm spin speed Zanussi-Electrolux ZWF1237W (11). Both have a 7kg capacity and clean well on cotton, easy-care and quick programs. However, this model's higher 1400rpm spin speed will save time and energy. It's available from Argos, Comet and Currys.

WORTH KNOWING The third machine in this series has a 1600rpm spin speed (see table below).

## **Don't Buys**

The Hotpoint Aqualtis AQXXL129 (21) and Indesit WIA121 (22) claim the dubious honour of being the first two washing machines we'd recommend that all *Which*? members avoid. In our latest test, these models struggled to get the basics right. Both were poor at removing tough stains, such as red wine, grease, chocolate and blood, on the cotton wash. The Hotpoint's easy-care program is also far from the best. Don't be tempted by the two machines' desirably short wash times because, overall, they have too many weaknesses to be worth buying.

# Which should you choose?

### **Best on a budget**

**TRICITY BENDIX 1260 £240 ONLINE** The 1260 (10) is good value at just £240. It's a basic model from a reliable brand so shouldn't let you down.

## **Best for impaired vision**

LG WM1437WFD £900 With well-spaced buttons that beep when pressed and a large LCD screen, the LG (12) is good for those with impaired vision.

## **Best for wheelchair users**

WHIRLPOOL AWO/D4705 £255 The door on the Whirlpool (18) opens wide and stays in position while the machine is being loaded. All the controls are easy to see and reach from a chair.

## **Best for impaired dexterity**

HOTPOINT WT721 £330 The Hotpoint (8) comes with well-spaced buttons, an easy-use handle and no filter to clean. However, according to our research, Hotpoint is an unreliable brand.

## **Best for reduced mobility**

**ZANUSSI-ELECTROLUX ZWF1237W £300** The detergent drawer and controls of the Zanussi (11) are easy to use, but the filter is hard to empty because it is low down. The best built-in model in this area is the AEG-Electrolux L12510Vi (23).

## **Best for the environment**

**LG WM1437WFD £900** The LG (12) has excellent energy use and water consumption – just 7.2 litres per kg on a standard wash compared with an average of 9.5 litres for the other models on test.

# Call in the big drums

### Find out how drum capacity relates to the amount of laundry a machine can hold

Using a larger-capacity machine (6kg or more) can save money as well as time, since the amount of water and energy used per kilogram of washing is often lower for these models – provided you fill it up each time. But just how much extra laundry does a bigger drum allow you to do?

A typical 6kg drum can take about six small towels, two pillowcases, six T-shirts, two sheets, two pairs of jeans and 14 socks. A 7.5kg drum allows you to fit in two extra pairs of jeans and four T-shirts. You'll need around eight small towels, five pairs of jeans, 30 socks, four pillow cases, three sheets and 15 T-shirts to fill an enormous 10kg drum.

A 6kg load is usually large enough for most households
