# Handheld & stick clean

## NEED TO KNOW

Handheld and stick vacs won't replace your fullsized one but, being small and light, they're ideal for confined spaces and dry spills. Only one vac on test – a Black & Decker (7) – can clean up wet spills.

HANDHELDS VS STICKS Handhelds are lighter and more compact than sticks. They fit easily in confined areas – inside your car, say – and they're great for fiddly jobs such as cleaning computer keyboards.

Sticks, so called because of their broom-like handles, are bigger. They're ideal for cleaning stairs, for which your main vac is too bulky and most handhelds too small.

### **CORDLESS VS MAINS**

A cordless model frees you from the restrictions of a power cable. But battery life is 25 minutes at best and recharging from flat takes up to 24 hours – so always return the cleaner to its recharge unit (most are wall-mountable) so you'll have power next time.

Mains power gives stronger suction, which is a real help for tough jobs such as removing pet hair. Speaking of which...

### PET HAIR

Plenty of full-sized vacs struggle with pet hair and the same is true of most of their mini counterparts. The key to successful pethair cleaning is nozzle design – ideally a rotating brush head (sometimes called a turbo brush) which can loosen the hair.

### **BEST BUYS**

Our Best Buys are brilliant cleaners, but they're also easy and comfortable to use. And they have handy accessories to make most tasks a doddle.

### HANDHELD CLEANERS

For a light and versatile allrounder that's great on stairs, look no further than the **Black** & Decker (1) mains vac. This little blue handheld is packed with accessories, including an extension hose and tube to give extra reach. It also has crevice nozzles, to reach into cracks, and brushes for keyboards or soft furnishings. Its compact size – just 30cm long - and accessories make it fantastic for most cleaning tasks. And it's great value at £30 from Miller Brothers.

If you want a cordless cleaner – ideal for cleaning car interiors – try the more expensive **Black & Decker (2)**. At only 11 minutes, battery life is rather short but, if you keep it on permanent recharge, that's not a big problem. The recharge unit is wall-mountable, and accessories include brush and crevice nozzles. It's £50 in Comet and Currys.

### **STICK CLEANERS**

All of the stick cleaners are good but the mains-powered **Morphy Richards**  $(9) - \pounds 50$ from Argos and Index – has the edge over its competitors.

Cleaning is excellent on carpets and worktops. And it's particularly useful on stairs: it's easy to manoeuvre and gets the job done quickly.

There are plenty of supplied accessories, including brush and crevice nozzles and an extension tube, which gives you that extra reach into awkward spaces.

An updated version, with an easily removable telescopic

handle, is being introduced from around now.

The mains-powered **Miele** (10) stick is too bulky for small jobs but it comes into its own on bigger carpet areas and it copes well with pet hair. At 1.4m long, it's bigger and heavier than other sticks but still twice as light as most fullsized vacs. It's a good choice if you have small rooms and don't like lugging around a normal vac. The best high-street price is £80 from Miller Brothers.

Both our Best Buy sticks are mains-powered. If you want a cordless model, the Hoover (11) and Electrolux (12) are worth considering. Both are good products but minor niggles prevent them from being up to Best Buy standard. The Hoover has short battery life and lacks accessories; the Electrolux's on-off switch is a touch hard to operate.
