Music on the go

Top choices for music on the move, some of our Best Buy MP3 players are also ideal for viewing photos or watching video

MP3 players and digital music have revolutionised the way we listen to and buy music. And with the launch of digital music downloads on Amazon.com, which will probably spread to the UK site, and rumours that Google is to launch a digital music service to compete with Apple's iTunes, this looks set to continue.

But an MP3 player isn't just for music enthusiasts. You can also listen to podcasts (see 'Jargon explained', p48), books, travel guides and walking tours. And some players have big colour screens, ideal for viewing photos or video.

In the last year MP3 players have become hugely popular and mainstream, because players are becoming easier to use and relatively cheap. And with increased access to broadband, people

can spend more time online for less money browsing and buying music.

The main manufacturers are focusing on new technology for the larger-capacity hard-disk or jukebox players, constantly trying to store more songs on smaller players and to steal market share from the dominant Apple iPod. There are also many tiny solid-state or Flash players with smaller memories that are much cheaper. See 'Jargon explained', p48, for explanations of the two different types.

Another option for mobile music is a combined phone with MP3 player. You'll find the Sony Ericsson W800i and Motorola ROKR in our table on p50.

Some brands of MP3 player are available online only, including Archos, iAudio and iRiver.

Testing more players, more auickly

We've recently changed the way we test MP3 players. We're now testing them in co-operation with European consumer groups. This big test runs year round and new releases go to the lab as soon as we can get hold of them. MP3 players will still feature regularly in the magazine but we'll also report on as many players as we can, as fast as we can, online.

And if you're wondering why the classic iPod is absent from our table, it's because with our new scoring system, it's no longer a Best Buy. See www.which.co.uk/ mp3s to see how the iPod and 15 other models performed.

More thorough testing

Our new testing is even more comprehensive. For your

listening pleasure, we drained 2,174 hours of batteries to check running time, whether playing music or video. We also uploaded and

downloaded 12GB worth of music to each player - which took 11,454 seconds (over three hours) - to check how long it takes to transfer music to and from the players.

Prices

Prices are the cheapest widely available high-street price for each memory size as we went to press. Where models are available online only, we say so.

The pencil-thin Nano is a solid-state player; its chunkier sibling is a hard-disk player. It's easy to use, with the same iPod scroll-wheel to control playing and track

selection. It also has a clear colour screen for viewing pictures, though it can't display video like its bigger brother. It comes with iTunes software, so you can manage your music, and more.

WORTH KNOWING iPod's little brother matches the original with great sound quality.

Plus all you need to know about podcasts and where to find them

TYPES OF PLAYER

Hard-disk players have built-in hard drives and can store many music files.

Solid-state players use a memory card to store music, and often have less capacity than harddisk players. You store tracks on your PC (or Mac) and download music to the player as you want it.

MUSIC FILE FORMATS

Most players support the MP3 format. Other formats are: AAC, used by Apple; ATRAC3, which is Sony's format; WMA, a Microsoft format, compatible with Windows Media Player; WAV, the default for audio files on Windows PCs. Flac and Ogg are free opensource formats.

■ MEMORY As a rule of thumb a typical, decentquality pop track uses about 4.5MB of memory. So a 20GB hard-disk

player can store about 4,500 songs and a 512MB solid-state player, about 120. You can reduce file sizes, but this reduces quality, too.

PODCASTING

Podcasting is the free and legal online distribution of music, talk – or a combination – that you can download to your MP3 player. DO IT YOURSELF

Anyone with basic

audio-editing software, an internet connection and some ideas can make a radio show, dubbed a podcast, and put it online.

WHERE TO FIND PODCASTS You can

download free podcasts of programmes from big broadcasters.

The BBC offers radio programmes from several stations to download at www.bbc.co.uk/radio/ downloadtrial. You can also subscribe to receive the latest programme automatically. Virgin Radio offers many of its shows as podcasts, at www.

virginradio.co.uk The Guardian offers specially recorded podcasts, as well as a weekly Media Guardian podcast, at

How to buy music

Restrictions and rights on music download services and software

RESTRICTED USE To deter illegal copying, most online music stores sell files that have restrictions on their use, known as Digital Rights Management or DRM. KNOW YOUR LIMIT DRM may include how many devices you can play the music on, how many times you can 'burn' it to CD or even how many times you can play a track.

INUDIO

For example, if you buy a song from iTunes for 79p, you can listen to it on five PCs, burn it to unlimited CDs and copy it to unlimited portable players.

However, if you buy the same song (for the same price as iTunes) from Tesco, you can listen to it on just one PC, burn it to just three CDs and copy it to just three players. ONLINE MUSIC

SOURCES In its test last year, Computing Which? found that the best were Panasonic Music Stream (www.panasonic musicstream.com), iTunes (www.itunes. co.uk) and Napster (www.napster.co.uk).

On both iTunes and Napster you'll have to download software to see the music on offer.

SUBSCRIPTION SERVICES With these

services, such as Napster-to-Go, you pay a subscription and download as much music (and videos) as you want. You can access the music for as long as you continue to subscribe.

Music phones

The Sony Ericsson W800i is a Best Buy phone (see p60); its music player is good but not quite good enough to be a Best Buy MP3 player. The Motorola ROKR, despite the hype and links to iTunes, is a letdown as a music player.

MP3 enthusiasts

Research has revealed, probably not surprisingly, that teenagers make up a disproportionately large group of iTunes users. Rather less predictably, iTunes users are 2.2 times more likely to own a Volkswagen than the average internet user. And iTunes users are most likely to drink cider in the pub.



25 10GB OR MORE 67% Samsung YH-J70 £180/£270

This little black and silver player is about the same size and shape as an iPod. It features an FM radio, which you can record from as well as listen to, and it has a colour display so you can view photos or watch video, although the screen is a bit small. It's

quick to load music on to the player. But battery life with the rechargeables supplied is a letdown – just nine hours of playing per charge.

EASY TO USE The supplied software is good and the player is easy to use – you navigate with a series of buttons.
