# High-definition **camcorders**

They'll generally cost more than an SD model, but do HD camcorders always produce the best video quality?

uying a high-definition (HD) camcorder for someone this Christmas? Make sure that you spend your money wisely. In our latest digital camcorder tests, we found that several HD camcorders didn't perform as well as expected – some models scored lower than the best standard-definition camcorders we tested (see the table, p52, for more details).

However, the best HD camcorders do outshine SD models – our seven Best Buys create sharp, colourful videos that look great on an SDTV set and even better on an HDTV. The downside is that they're expensive, with the exception of the Samsung HMX-H100P, which is excellent value at just £319.

If you're certain that you want to invest in an HD model, take a look at our moneysaving tips, right. It is possible to track down a bargain, even if you've got your eye on the best-quality models.

To get the most out of a digital camcorder it's essential to have a PC or laptop. This will help you to edit your movies before uploading them to the internet or burning them to a DVD.

# How to save money when buying a digital camcorder

Some camcorders are expensive because they have large internal hard drives. Consider a cheaper camcorder that records to memory card – we found the Canon HF200 for almost £150 less than the virtually identical Canon HF20.

You'll find deals on new and refurbished Canon camcorders at http:// stores.shop.ebay.co.uk/ Canon-Outlet. As these



are sold at auction rather than for a set price, you can make some major savings by bidding. Argos runs an eBay clearance store at http:// stores.shop.ebay.co.uk/ Clearance-Bargains.

When new camcorders are launched (in spring and before Christmas), the older versions they're replacing usually go down in price – a great time to snap up a bargain.

# **Sony HDR-XR520** £927

#### Which? test score 85% Brand reliability 95%

PROS The XR520 has a huge 240GB hard drive – enough memory for around 29 hours of video at the highest quality setting. Video quality is exceptional, and you can also take good-quality photos. The image stabiliser (which reduces the effects of shaky hands) works very well. CONS It isn't cheap, and it's not light. With the battery in place and the wrist strap attached, the camcorder weighs more than half a kilo.

## Canon HF200 £508 Which? test score 80%

Brand reliability 95% PROS This camcorder is cheaper

than the Canon HF20 as it lacks an internal memory, recording to SD or SDHC memory card instead. Other than that, it's identical. Videos are sharp and detailed, and sound quality is generally good. CONS You'll have to buy a memory

card. There's no viewfinder – it can be tricky to keep your hand steady while zooming and looking at the screen. Full review www.which.co.uk/ CanonHF200

## Canon HF S100 £725 Which? test score 82%

## Brand reliability 95%

PROS Overall, the Canon HF S100 produces excellent HD videos – they're extremely sharp, and subtle differences between colours are clearly visible. The autofocus is fast and dependable, there's a x10 zoom, and the image stabiliser is excellent. **CONS** We noticed a small amount of graininess in videos taken in a dimly lit room. It doesn't have an internal hard drive (which is surprising, given the price) or a viewfinder.

## **GZ-X900** £669 Which? test score 77%

Brand reliability 92%

PROS At 299g, the X900 is far lighter than most HD camcorders. The quality of sound captured on the internal mic is great. Videos look stunning – colours, shadows and highlights are faithfully reproduced. CONS Battery life is below average – we found the X900 lasts for just 78 minutes on a full charge. The x5 optical zoom is modest – most HD camcorders have zooms of x10 or above. Full review www.which.co.uk/

# **Canon HF20** £655

#### Which? test score 80% Brand reliability 95%

**PROS** Image quality is superb. It has a good range of features, including an effective image stabiliser, 32GB of built-in flash memory (enough for around three hours of high-quality footage) and a x15 zoom, which is generous for an HD camcorder.

CONS Taking still pictures can be a little frustrating, as the shutter speed is quite slow. The LCD screen is tricky to view in bright sunlight, and there's no viewfinder.

## **Samsung HMX-H100P** £319

Which? test score 75% Brand reliability 96%

**PROS** This compact camcorder is a bargain – its video quality really impressed our testers. It has a x10 zoom, and the autofocus and image stabiliser are very effective. It weighs just 389g, so it's easy to carry and won't strain your arm.

CONS Sound quality is less impressive – and unfortunately you can't improve it by attaching an external mic. We think the still photo mode is disappointing. Full review www.which.co.uk/ SamsungHMXH100P

## Panasonic HDC-HS20 £467

Which? test score 72% Brand reliability 96%

PROS With the HDC-HS20 you have the option to record to the internal hard drive or a memory card. The 80GB hard drive can store more than 10 hours of footage at the highest quality setting. The camcorder fits into your hand easily and weighs just 411g. Videos are captured with crisp, satisfying detail – you can even see subtle distinctions between colours. The image stabiliser is very effective. CONS We found that the camcorder's autofocus system struggles a little with panning shots at wide angles – for example, when you're panning across a landscape. Unfortunately, sound quality is nothing special, and you can't add an external mic to improve it. Battery life is below average, and there's no viewfinder. # Standard definition Canon FS22 £410

Which? test score 69% Brand reliability 95%

**PROS** The Canon FS22 has 32GB of flash memory - that's large enough to store more than seven hours of footage at the highest quality setting. Overall video quality is good - pictures are more detailed and colours are more accurate than on most SD camcorders. This model has an impressive x37 optical zoom lens and a good electronic image stabiliser.

**CONS** The FS22 doesn't have a viewfinder to help you compose your shots. We also found that the still photo mode is poor – there's an obvious shutter delay when you're taking a



photo. Video quality is good, but it can't match the ultra-sharp quality of a Best Buy HD camcorder. If you have an HD television it may be worth considering one of the cheaper HD Best Buys, such as the Panasonic HDC-HS20 (above). Full review www.which. co.uk/CanonFS22

# How we test

#### We don't just focus on video quality in our tests – sound gets a thorough evaluation, too

A camcorder that produces stunning visuals can sometimes be let down by poor sound. We therefore put camcorders through a rigorous series of audio tests. As well as assessing how well each camcorder records voices and music, we test the efficiency of built-in wind filters and whether sound is improved by adding an external microphone.
