Anthony's at Flannels in Leeds offers a good-value set menu at lunchtime

With the credit crunch hitting home, the GFG offers advice on eating out without breaking the bank **Meal deals**

For many of us, eating out is no longer restricted to expensive special occasions. Over the past decade, the rise in gastropubs, bistros and deli-cafés means that going out to dinner is a casual, spontaneous treat if we don't fancy cooking at home. But as the cost of food and fuel spirals, eating out becomes an obvious target for cutting back.

So if you have a small budget but a large appetite, here's some advice so that you don't have to tighten your belt too much.

Look out for set menus, which are a great way of sampling very good restaurants without busting your budget. Top chefs often offer good, imaginative three-course set menus for little more than the cost of a normal main course. They're popular for lunch, but it's worth looking out for evening deals, too, especially pre- and post theatre.
