# **Pushing good**

Pushchairs may be more catwalk than sidewalk nowadays, but don't spend a lot to get one that is functional and fashionable

Pushchairs come in all shapes and sizes to suit many lifestyles. Lightweight buggies are handy for short strolls through busy places, while sturdy strollers are more comfortable for parent and baby. Bulky travel systems, including car seats, try to address all needs, and the big all-terrain three-wheelers are better suited to the open road than the urban bus.

It seems almost impossible to buy a pushchair to meet all eventualities - needs change as babies grow. Although many new parents try to buy one pushchair from birth to toddler, many end up buying a lighter stroller for shopping and holidays as their child gets older.

So for this test we've concentrated on lightweight buggies to use as a second pushchair and high-end strollers to last for the longest possible time.

## 79% Ziko Frankie £150

Our parent testers have many nice things to say about this funky stroller, because of its good looks, sturdiness and lovely handling. The spacious seat is good for older babies, but the

restraints are a bit baggy for smaller ones. The clip that holds the pushchair when folded is difficult to undo and the brake levers will hit stairs. Even so, all our testers were impressed and certain they would consider buying it. WE LIKE The well-padded seat and adjustable leg support provide comfort.

## These new kids on the block must learn more about practicality

Buying two pushchairs could dent your pocket seriously, especially if you are following your favourite celebrity and opting for the trendiest pushchair that money can buy.

Strollers are coming in for serious attention from fashionistas. We've pitted a Maclaren designed by furniture designer Philippe Starck, the Jeep Candy and the Wow Oui by interior designer Anna Ryder-Richardson against some less starry competitors.

Though they are by no means disasters, these new kids on the block must learn more about practicality before we'll make them Best Buys.

Still, there are several attractive pushchairs that are practical enough to be Best Buys - and they are also good value for money.

## 78% Silver Cross **POP** £89

This is an attractive, lightweight buggy, that's equally good for nipping around the shops or strolling in the park. It's particularly easy to fold and unfold. Testers were divided on the

comfort of the handles. But it is easy to move around – apart from on stairs,

on which the brake levers can catch. The small storage basket is difficult to reach with the seat at its lowest position. This pushchair is widely available online.

WORTH KNOWING You can also buy a matching footmuff, headhugger and parasol.

## 80% Mamas & Papas Nipi £59

This pretty-in-pink pushchair is perfect for parents who want something small and light to chuck in the car boot for supermarket trips or for getting around town. It's the easiest of those we tested to fold and carry, and

the five-point harness is particularly simple to use.

The seat is easy to recline but, when it is, the roomy shopping basket can be quite hard to access. Watch out for the brake lever, as it can tend to catch when you're on stairs. You'll find this model at Mamas & Papas.

## 77% Chicco CT 0.4 £120

This sturdy stroller is good for walks in the outdoors. It provides a smooth ride and its large wheels make steps quite easy to manage. The headhugger, adjustable leg support and flat recline make it suitable for small babies, but larger kids may find the backrest a bit short. It's bulky when folded so you'll need a big boot. It's available widely, from Argos, Mothercare and

Toys R Us. WATCH OUT The pale-coloured

## **79% Cosatto Diablo** £150

This stylish stroller is a great compromise between offering space and storage, while being easy to fold and transport. It's easy to manoeuvre but the brake levers can catch on stairs. Its size also makes it best to carry rather than wheel down stairs. The angled handles are comfortable but they are

## **77% Maclaren** Triumph £75

This is great for an older toddler or as a lightweight buggy for holidays. It's easy to manoeuvre, great on stairs and its light frame and one-handed folding capability make it good for using on buses and

trains. The backrest is

not as easy to lower as it is on other Best Buys and the nautical flag on the backrest is difficult to clean. Most parent testers thought they would buy one, though. It's available from John Lewis and Mothercare.

WE FOUND It is difficult to access the storage when the backrest is reclined.

# What you should look for

#### HANDLES

Choose those that turn inward to support the wrist in a natural position and make

pushing comfortable. Check you can find a comfortable position

## FOLDING MECHANISMS

Easy folding is vital. Look for one-handed folding where you don't have to detach accessories

#### **BRAKE LEVERS**

These should be easy to put on and off. Brake pedals projecting beyond the wheels can catch on stairs and engage the brakes. A bar connecting the rear brakes can obstruct your feet





ADJUSTABLE LEG SUPPORT This gives good calf support for smaller children who can't reach the footrest

#### RECLINE

Look for a mechanism that is easy to operate with your child in the seat. The best pushchairs

for newborns have a recline that is greater than 150 degrees



## PADDED HARNESS Padding can make wearing a harness

more comfortable

## SUSPENSION

Good suspension will make uneven paths more comfortable for your baby

This zippy stroller is perfect for busy parents. It's easy to handle in most situations – except on steps where brake levers can catch. The recline is suitable for young babies, but lowering the seat requires two hands and blocks the

# SWorth tracking down

The Graco Aerosport – which scored 82 per cent in our tests – has been discontinued but would be an ideal purchase if you can find it

This solid pushchair is great for people who want many useful features and a smooth ride for their baby. We like the parents' tray with cup holders and excellent under-seat basket that is easy to reach, even with the seat reclined. It is not hard to move when

folded, but it does take up space in a car boot. This cool-coloured pushchair is good for babies large or small.

It was also available as part of a travel system with the Autobaby car seat, which, although acceptable, was not a Best Buy when tested.

It came in denim and grey (travel system only) and with a hood, cup holders, play tray and headhugger as standard and has a 150-degree recline.

## **Testing concerns**

#### Two models had particular problems

Phil and Ted's Smart (right) has a poorly designed harness. and the seat poppers came undone when it was pushed down stairs with a 15kg dummy. Phil and Ted's said the buggy passed BS7409 'with flying colours...is certified as unimpeachably safe. If you drop the buggy down steps with sufficient force the domes may well pop in the manner suggested, but... vou'd have to be incredibly rough'. It will update its safety certification 'in due course'.

The Little

Shield Meribel had a problem when it was pulled backwards up stairs - the brake pedals caught and wrenched the wheels out of the frame. They were not attached firmly enough. Little Shield said it was 'extremely alarmed...and we have immediately reviewed all of our stock here but have been unable to replicate your findings'. It added: 'All of our products are tested and certified by UK test houses.'

Our testing looks at safety, durability, comfort and usability, and includes views of a panel of parents

## Safety and stamina

Our lab experts check whether each pushchair meets the British Standard

BS7409:1996 required for legal sale in the UK and also BS EN1888:2003. a more recent and stringent standard but one that is only a guide.

Checking the standards

involves more than 30 tests, from strength and stability to choking hazards and finger traps. We also consider the quality of restraints as well as brakes and locking mechanisms. Each pushchair is also wheeled for 28km along a bumpy treadmill track to see how it will stand up to a life of uneven pavements and potholes.

#### Ease of use Our experts consider

whether each chair suits children of different ages, is easy for a carer



to use and how good it is to transport folded and by car. They also have fun smearing the fabric with beef stew and fruit purée and trying to clean it all off again.

## **Parents' paces**

Parents with tots aged between 6 and 36 months put the pushchairs through their paces on pavements, bumpy ground, stairs and around obstacles. They rate how easy each chair is to push, fold, carry and adjust and comment on aspects such as appearance and useful features.
