Masters of spin

In the battle to be the best washing machine, can anyone catch Miele? And why are washing cycles getting shorter?

Over the past couple of years, in our washing machines test, Miele has proven itself to be the brand to beat. And once again, it has produced the spin kings, with four out of our nine Best Buys coming from its range.

However, our tests show that brands such as Zanussi-Electrolux, AEG-Electrolux and Bosch are closing in and challenging Miele's primacy. We've tested 27 machines from 19 different brands, with prices ranging from a budget £230 to £820. We've awarded two Best Buys to built-in models, which hasn't happened for some time (see p55). We also take a look at the new wave of energy-saving, low-temperature 30°C programs and how they compare with popular 40°C programs (see 'Turning down the heat', p54).

We expect to see more machines with the shorter 40°C programs in shops soon The latest Bosch machines are some of the first models to feature shorter main 40°C wash programs, saving both time and energy. But if your clothes require more than a just light wash, you may find yourself reverting to a more typical twohour cycle. With many of the leading brands, including Indesit and Zanussi-Electrolux and , planning major launches, we expect to see more machines with faster programs hitting the shops before too long.

We've also tested machines from two newcomers to the market, ISE (9) and White Knight (21). Neither machine can match our Best Buys but both turn in creditable first efforts, with the ISE machine making it into the top ten in our table, p56.

Checklist

How to choose the right program for the right item. If in doubt, check the label

Temperature guide

 30°C Good for saving energy and can be used for cleaning most items but won't shift tough stains.
40°C Good for

everyday clothes, such as jeans – natural fabrics (cotton or linen) or synthetics (viscose, acrylics) and wool mixtures. **50°C** Nylon, cotton, viscose and polyester/ cotton mixtures should be able to withstand the warmer wash. 60°C Best for bed linen, towels and heavily soiled garments such as baby clothes. 90°C The hottest wash program you'll find on most machines. Use this only for white cotton sheets and

Shorter cycles are on the way. But you may need more time for really dirty clothes

For more than a decade the race for an A-grade energy label has seen 40°C wash times settle at about two hours – but this could soon change. Machine makers say clothes are usually lightly soiled and worn only once before being washed.

As a result, many new machines will have shorter main 40°C programs, suited to removing lighter stains such as sweat. For washing larger loads, you'll need to select an intensive option, as described in the manual.

The Bosch washers we tested are among the first to use this. Their 40°C programs are up to 45 minutes shorter than on other models. Without the intensive option, the programs score badly on a full load, so for a fair comparison we tested the standard 40°C wash using the intensive mode.

A Bosch spokesman said: 'Based on extensive market research of actual user behaviour, we found smaller quantities of less soiled items are washed more often. So we developed a program which used less energy and water.'

Which should you choose?

Best on a budget

AEG-ELECTROLUX L52810,

£299 The L52810 (13) is a good all-rounder and good value. It cleans and rinses well, and AEG-Electrolux has a solid reliability record. If you'd like a model under £250, opt for the Beko (8); however, we don't have enough information to judge the brand's reliability.

Best for a family ZANUSSI-ELECTROLUX

ZWF1451, £379 This machine (5) has a large 7kg capacity, so you can do more washing in one go. A 1400rpm spin speed means that clothes will spend less time in the tumble dryer or on the



washing line, and brand reliability is solid. Its only weakness is poor rinsing.

Best for single people

BOSCH WAE 2416S Classixx,

£330 This machine (10) is ideal for items which have been worn once and have only light dirt such as sweat or deodorant. It's simple to use, cheap to run and provides great



cleaning at 40°C if you use the intensive option for larger loads or clothes with stubborn stains. However, it's noisier than many other models.

Best for the environment

MIELE W1714, £700 and AEG-ELECTROLUX

L52810, £299 Of the small number of machines we've tested at 30°C, the Miele (2), pictured right, and AEG-Electrolux (13) are the most competent. Energy and water use are low and, importantly, rinsing isn't compromised.



Turning down the heat

Can washing at a lower temperature save energy and get your clothes clean?

TURN TO 🔫

Most people in the UK regularly use wash cycles at 40°C. Research, supported by the Energy Saving Trust, suggests households can save enough energy to power 500,000 homes and 640 stadiums for a year by switching to cleaning clothes at 30°C. Lowtemperature washing could also save £170 million in energy bills.

The selection of machines we tested at 30°C produced promising results. Cleaning ability is slightly worse than at

40°C because the detergent has to work harder, but rinsing improved and program times are often faster. Average energy savings per wash were 41 per cent,

which equates to around £6 a year. Water use was similar to the 40°C program. Some detergent makers suggest you use special detergents for washing at 30°C but in our latest detergent test we found you don't necessarily need to use these washing powders to get good results (see 'Powder to the people', p58).

We also tested the super-quick program on the Bosch WAS 24466 Logixx (11), which

washes around three pairs of jeans (2kg of clothes) in 15 minutes. We found it works well for freshening clothes and removing sweat.

Family ties

How to pick a similar model

When we test washing machines, we find out all sorts of information about models that vary in minor ways from those tested. The table, below, lists machines which are almost identical to those tested and should be of similar quality.



1 FREESTANDING 66% Miele W1512 £499

The W1512 just about outperformed the other Mieles. It's a good choice for people with sensitive skin because rinsing is strong, and cleaning is outstanding on cotton and quick programs. The filter height makes it easy to clean. Available at Comet. WE LIKE The W1512 is about £100 cheaper than the W1514 and came higher in the table.

Our cheapest Best Buy is packed full of useful features and provides a great cotton wash. We especially like the clever memory function and the user-friendly monitor. Available from Comet and John Lewis.

largest drum of all the Mieles on test.

This model is subtly different from the other Miele models we've looked at. It lacks the slightly angled slimline control panel used on the W1512 (1) and W1514 (4), and the porthole opening is smaller. But cotton and quick programs are excellent and it's also cheap to run. Available from Comet.

Know the number

Decoding the model number

Every washing machine has a manufacturer's model number so that it can be identified. With a little know-how, this is often a quick way of finding out useful information about the machine. Unfortunately, each manufacturer uses a different system for assigning model numbers, so you can't apply these rules across the board, but a few seconds' study may help you track down the machine you want. The example is for the Beko WMA620W (8). The selection of machines we've tested at 30°C produced promising results

Good cleaning across the board is the strength of this Miele. It looks identical to the W1512 (1), but its higher spin speed will reduce time needed to dry clothes. It's a good choice if you have sensitive skin. Available from Comet.

We give you the lowdown on some of the best machines for disabled users

Impaired vision

This AEG-Electrolux has a strong combination of clear, easily readable text, lights that highlight selected options and easy programming – all of which mean this Best Buy model is particularly well suited to those people with vision problems.

Wheelchair users

Brightly lit controls and a functional design make this Hotpoint simple to use from a seated position. Loading and unloading isn't a problem, either. However, according to our research, Hotpoint is an unreliable brand.

Manual dexterity

Using a machine can be hard if you have a poor grip but well-spaced controls, an easy-to-use door and easy access to the filter on this AEG can certainly make life easier.

Reduced mobility

You don't have to bend over too far to use this Siemens. The sympathetic lighting also means that it's simple to view different program options while standing up.
