Printers An update on our Best Buys

BEST BUYS

Canon continues to provide the best all-round deal on inkjet printers. For the past two years it has married quality, speed and versatility with low running costs, and the new Pixma range is no different. The **Canon** (1), £300 from Jessops, is the flagship replacement for the **Canon** (5), hard to find but still available online, from £230. Its only drawback is slow text output.

The **Epson** (4), £240 from Jessops, produces the best photo prints. However, a set of eight Epson ink-cartridges costs about £90 and this model costs twice as much to run as the top-scoring Canon - so we think the Epson is best left to the hardcore digital photographer.

The **Canon** (3), £99 from Jessops, is a good midrange choice and it has a wireless equivalent, the **Canon** (2), £199 from Jessops. If your computer is compatible with Wi-Fi (802.11 g/b), you can print without using a USB cable - handy if several machines share a printer, or if you use a laptop.

The Canon (6), £69 from Jessops, is a great entrylevel choice that outshines printers at over three times its price. Lightning-fast on black-and-white text, but a little ponderous for photos, it reflects recent big improvements at the cheaper end of the market.
