An update on our Best Buys

BEST BUYS

More Isofix seats, which attach directly to the car without using seat belts, are appearing. We've already tested the Britax Duo Plus. Now Britax has launched the first Isofix seat for newborn babies, and other makers plan to launch Isofix seats soon. As more new cars include Isofix mounts, the new seats should be easier to install and so reduce the risks associated with incorrect fitting.

We hope to include the new seats in our next tests, to be published later this year. Meanwhile, here's an update on our current Best Buys.

FOR CHILDREN UP TO 13kg

The three Best Buys in this category are the **Britax (1)**, £90 from John Lewis or Mothercare, and the **Maxi-Cosi (2)**, £60, and the **Mothercare (3)**, £40, both from Mothercare. The Britax is the easiest to use; threading the belt through the Mothercare is trickier. The Britax and Maxi-Cosi can be used in a pram or carrycot as well as a car.

FOR CHILDREN 9kg TO 18kg

If you have a car with Isofix mounts, the **Britax (4)**, £179 from John Lewis, is easy to use. For cars without Isofix mounts, go for a **Maxi-Cosi** seat from Halfords – the SPS **(5)**, £90, or XP **(6)**, £100.

FOR CHILDREN 15kg TO 36kg

The **Maxi-Cosi** (7) is comfortable and easy to use, and gives good overall protection. Buy it at Halfords or Toys R Us for \pounds 80. The **Britax** (8) is still up with the leaders and costs \pounds 79 at John Lewis.
