# **BEST BUYS**

We've tested six new Freeview set-top boxes – but none is as good as our previous Best Buys, also in the table below.

To be a Best Buy, a box must be able to show the seven-day Freeview electronic programme guide (EPG), which makes recording digital TV much easier. It must also be easy to use and have decent reception.

The top-scoring Humax (1), £85 from John Lewis, is easy to use, as is the EPG, and has all the features you're likely to need. It has two Scart outputs, but will also suit older TVs without Scarts, as it can be hooked up to the aerial socket, too. Some readers have reported that the EPG doesn't contain the full seven-day listings. Humax tells us that an 'over the air' software update should now have rectified this.

The Sony (2), £100 from Argos, Comet, Dixons, John Lewis, Miller Brothers and Powerhouse, is the only other box to meet our stringent requirements. It's got virtually the same features as the Humax and a decent EPG. But it can't be connected to a TV aerial input, so consider this box only if your TV has Scart sockets. Unlike our Best Buys,

two boxes – the Digifusion (3) and Echostar (7) – have the viewing card slot necessary for Top-Up TV, the pay-TV service that offers an additional package of channels for £8 a month – see www. topuptv.co.uk for details. If you're interested in this, the Digifusion (3) is the one to go for.

Two boxes have unusual features. The Sagem (6) has a slot that accepts all digital camera memory cards so you can display your photos on TV. The rewind feature of the cheaper Digifusion (8) can store 30 seconds of TV programming so you can replay footage – though we think that's too short a time to be really useful.
