INKJET PRINTERS

Our Best Buys take account of print quality, speed, print costs, versatility, ease of use and noise. With cheap inkjets, you have to change all the ink cartridges even if just one colour runs out. Images look better on plasticcoated photo paper (up to about £1 a sheet). Last test: July 2005



CANON Pixma iP8500

£327 from Jessops Our best all-rounder prints high-quality photos and is also good if you print a lot of text documents. SCORE 78%

CANON iP3000 £79 from Jessops

If you're not a keen photographer and can live without fine level of detail, the iP3000 performs well on all counts and is the cheapest inkjet to run. SCORE 77%



CANON iP4000 £100 from Comet, Dixons, Currys, Jessops, PC World A wired iP4000R (see above) – and just as good. SCORE 76%



CANON iP4000R

£190 from Jessops This wireless Canon is just pipped by the iP3000 for text speed. Other than that, it performs well in all key areas. You'll need a WiFi computer. **SCORE 77%**



EPSON Stylus Photo R800 £240 from Jessops

Great for printing photos but let down by text speed, versatility and print costs of £282 over three years. SCORE 74%

PORTABLE

Portables let you produce prints when you're away from your computer – photos are usually 6x4in, though you can get other sizes (you need special paper). They're easy to carry but still have to be plugged in. Our Best Buys print well from both cameras and PCs. Last test: July 2005



CANON Selphy CP600 £200 from Jessops Photos are great from a camera and outstanding from a computer. Doesn't accept memory cards (for linking to a camera). SCORE 65%



EPSON PictureMate Personal Photo Lab £149 from John Lewis Impressive results from PC and, though slow, from camera. Can connect to Bluetooth mobile phones. SCORE 61%

LASER PRINTERS

These are good for printing a lot of pages cheaply and quickly. As they use powder rather than ink, definition is better than with inkjets (powder doesn't run the way ink does), and type of paper isn't an issue. But they're heavier and harder to set up and can't reproduce colours as accurately. Last test: July 2005



EPSON Aculaser C1100 £225 from Miller Brothers Prints lots of colour pages quickly and cheaply, and photo quality is great. It's also easier to use than most lasers. SCORE 69%
