TUMBLE DRIERS

Our Best Buy tumble driers stand out from the pack because they dry more quickly, evenly and energy efficiently, without being too noisy. They're not too much of a hassle to use and clean, either.

All of our Best Buys have sensors that stop the drier automatically when the clothes are dry enough to iron or put straight into the cupboard. They have a wide range of automatic programs, too, including several different options for cottons and easy-care fabrics.

CONDENSER

These models trap water from your washing in a container. You can install them wherever you like, but they use more energy than vented models and take more looking after.

VENTED

These models expel damp air from the room via a hose out of the window or a permanent vent in the wall. They're relatively cheap, but the vent restricts the locations where you can put them.

MIELE T4123 £500 from Miller

Brothers Finishes off a full load of cottons in an hour and 15 minutes – quicker than any other drier we've tested. The display panel is simpler than that on the condenser drier, and the lint filter is easy to get at. **SCORE 65%**



BOSCH WTA4107 £250 from Currvs and Miller Brothers

This Bosch is slightly less easy to use than the Miele, above, because the door is a bit smaller and the lint filter is harder to clean. But it's cheaper, dries clothes swiftly, and is otherwise well designed. **SCORE 61%**

CONDENSER

Miller Brothers The most advanced drier we've tested scores the highest in our tests. But maximum load is only 5kg, and the heat exchanger, which needs to be cleared of fluff four or five times a year, is tricky to reach. **SCORE 64%**



BOSCH WTL6307 EXXCEL £420 from Miller Brothers

At less than half the price of the Miele, the Bosch has 1kg more capacity, which means you can pack in about four more shirts. The heat exchanger is also easier to reach. **SCORE 61%**



AEG T57800 £550 from

Miller Brothers This replaces our previous Best Buy, the AEG T57760 – changes are cosmetic only. We particularly liked its lint filter, which pops out at the press of a button to make cleaning it easier. **SCORE 59%**
