Carpet stain removers

In our latest tests on carpet stain removers, cheaper products and even washing-up liquid outdid some of the best-known brands

Washing-up liquid

Diluted washing-up liquid got rid of blood, fresh Ribena and dried-in red wine. It didn't remove dried-in coffee but was as good as or better than many specialist options.

79% Sainsbury's Carpet & Upholstery Cleaner £2.43

This cleaner was outstanding on fresh Ribena, red wine and chocolate spread, and great on most dried-in stains. It's easy to use – just spray it on and leave it to do the work.

> here's a huge array of carpet stain removers in the shops, but new Which? tests have shown that ordinary washing-up liquid outperforms many of them.

> In our tough tests we daubed pale carpet with black coffee, diluted Ribena, red wine, chocolate spread, curry sauce and blood. As stain remedies aren't always to hand in real life, we let each stain dry overnight. We also created a set of fresh stains and used 17 popular stain removers on both sets. We threw two home remedies into the mix: soapy

This was the best all-rounder in our test, leaving no trace of fresh or dried-in stains apart from dried-in black coffee.

water made with washing-up liquid, and soda water.

Stain reaction

Although the Best Buys had the edge with some stains (see above), and are worth adding to your cupboard for when disaster strikes, the washing-up liquid solution was as good or better on blood and fresh Ribena, and did a terrific job on red wine. Only chocolate spread and dried-in coffee defeated it and our Best Buys did slightly better on these stains. **We used Morning**

Fresh liquid, which cost us 78p. It isn't a Best Buy washing-up liquid, so it's likely that other brands will work, too.

Forget soda water, though. It was good at removing blood and fresh Ribena, but it didn't match the specialist products on the other stains.

We also found some real differences between the specialist products. Cheap spray options from Sainsbury's and



76% Tesco Carpet & Upholstery Cleaner £2.44

Tesco's cleaner was really effective on fresh coffee and Ribena. It also vanquished dried-in Ribena and red wine. There's no need to scrub – just apply the cleaner and leave it.

75% Bissell OxyKIC £7.82

Bissell OxyKIC was fantastic on fresh coffee, Ribena and red wine stains. It was easy to apply, and the initial unpleasant smell faded within a day.

Tesco outclassed the big brand names Vanish and 1001. In general, we found liquid and aerosol sprays easier to apply than other formats, and results were better. It was tricky to apply foam and brush products without being wasteful.

The Bissell Carpet & Upholstery Cleaner (17) is a Don't Buy. As well as finding it difficult to apply, it wasn't good at removing stains, and we found that it removed the colour from dark carpet when left unattended.

HOW TO TACKLE TRICKY STAINS

A brief guide to the best techniques for tough marks

For all stains It's best to remove any solids and blot spills with a paper towel. Work from the outside in, so the stain doesn't spread. Avoid scrubbing, as you may damage carpet fibres.



Red wine In our tests, the Sainsbury's (1) and Bissell (4) Best Buy cleaners were great on fresh stains, and washing-up liquid was superb on dried stains. In our tests we've found that white wine reduces the colouration really well, but it also spreads the stain. On fresh stains, it's worth trying a paste made of baking powder and water. Salt is messy to use and disappointing on fresh stains. Mud Allow mud to dry, then



vacuum it up and use soapy water or a stain remover to get rid of embedded particles. **Wax** Cover embedded wax with a brown paper bag or kitchen paper, place a cloth on top and iron on the lowest setting. The paper absorbs the melted wax. **Dog dirt** Use a piece of thick cardboard to skim solids off the carpet. Apply soapy water or a stain remover to the remainder. This may take several applications.
