We pick the best packages for editing digital photos and home movies, and for mapping out your family tree

hat better present to give to budding photographers, film directors or family historians than computer software that helps them get more from their hobby?

With photo-editing software, they'll be able to enhance and retouch digital photographs, and restore old photos that have been scanned into a computer. Video-editing packages can be used to turn digital camcorder footage into memorable home movies.

Which? has also tested family-tree software – although it won't do the actual genealogy research, it'll help historians organise all the information they've gathered in one place.

Here, we've selected five Best Buy packages that impressed our computing experts and would make great gifts.

Nonceptor Photoshop Elements 8 (£57) cost £6 less than Paint Shop Pro Photo X2 Ultimate when we checked prices, but you may find either Best Buy for less if you shop around online.

Unwanted presents

It's worth bearing in mind that the rules on returning software differ slightly from those on other goods. Even if you still have the receipt, most retailers won't take back working software that has been opened, so keep software shrinkwrapped if you can't use it. If you're buying the software as a gift,

If you're buying the software as a gift, encourage the recipient to check the program's system requirements before removing any packaging. (The requirements will be printed on the box, and we've also listed them opposite.) That way, if their computer can't run the software, they'll be able to return it.

like hard work, don't worry – the default settings are good, too, and should be more than acceptable for most people's needs, allowing you to get started quickly. **CONS** Family Historian 4 lacks some of the online genealogy research tools available with other programs.

extremely flexible. The software enables you to make detailed adjustments to your

digital photos. The advanced tool for removing red eye from photographs is excellent – it enables you to change pupil lightness, glint lightness and size, eye hue and iris size. The online tutorials are good, and the help function is comprehensive.

CONS A complete beginner will have to work hard to master this program. We think the software's automatic picture correction tool could be better, and installation is rather long-winded.

Adobe Photoshop Elements 8 £57



Which? test score 75% PROS Photoshop Elements is a consistent Best Buy. Elements 8, the latest version, is a sophisticated package with lots of features, but it's

flexible – you can select your skill level when using tools. It includes some interesting new features, including people recognition – identify someone in your photos and the program will locate the same face in other pictures. The red eye removal tool is quick and precise, and the scratch removal tool works well.

CONS It was sluggish when we tried it on a lower-spec PC that still met the system requirements.

The software comes with a comprehensive and well-presented PDF manual on disc, together with built-in help that makes it easy to find any information you want. **CONS** The software can automatically detect scene changes but it sometimes splits video clips slightly early, and the thumbnail images it assigns to clips are slightly confusing as a result. The editingtrim window, where you can perform fine editing on your clips, isn't as well designed as in the previous version of the software. These are minor issues, though.
