# **Ring the changes**

Cordless phones allow you to make calls from any room in your house. We pick the best

While the first cordless phones offered the simple novelty of chatting to friends as you were walking around the house, the latest models mimic the new wave of mobiles in looks and in features, which range from texting and paging to polyphonic ringtones and games.

For many of us, though, the simple things are still key. We want a phone that's easy to use. It should have longlasting batteries, so we're less likely to be cut off during an important call, and the range to give good reception even if you have a big house with thick walls.

Our Best Buys have all these things as well as more features than their rivals. They cost between £70 and £110 but if that seems pricey, we have given

What you should look for

details of two good Budget Buys. These aren't widely available on the high street but can be found online.

For the second test in a row, Panasonic is the brand to beat. Great sound quality on both handset and answering machine is what makes its two models stand out. BT was also a strong performer and two of its phones are our other Best Buys.

On the downside, several phones were badly designed and difficult to use. The Binatone Icarus (22) doesn't have an LCD display screen, which makes storing numbers on to its memory a game of blind man's buff. The tiny buttons and slimline design of the Binatone iDect (20) gave it more style than substance and made it frustrating to use.

Speed dial, texting, polyphonic ringtones and caller ID options are all features of this great all-rounder. There is an illuminated screen and buttons to make the phone easier to use in the evening. When it gets to bedtime, you can switch to night mode which will lower the ringtone volume.

You can pick up answer machine messages from the base station and the



handset, and the base station has dial keys so you can use it to make calls. The two can also form an intercom system - handy for telling the kids that dinner is ready. The phone is available from Comet, Currys, John Lewis and The Link

## 73% BT Diverse 6350 £110

If you buy a cordless telephone you may still want a traditional phone as well in case the batteries on the cordless model run out and you need to make an emergency call. The BT Diverse 6350 has both types of phone and an answering machine. Like the Panasonic KX-TCD240 you can make calls with the base station or handset.

Features include texting. an illuminated display screen and an intercom system between handset

and base station. It has a Sim card reader so you can transfer numbers from your mobile to the home phone.

It stores 200 numbers. The BT Diverse 6350 is available from Argos. WATCH OUT It has the worst sound quality of all our Best Buys.

## 71% BT Equinox **1350**£100

You'll like this if you have a hectic social life – it stores 250 phone numbers. As with our other BT Best Buy, the Equinox 1350 has a Sim card reader so you can transfer numbers you've collected from your mobile. It's one of just a few models tested to have dial keys on the base station so you don't need to rely on the handset to make calls.



You can send texts and set up the base station and handset as an intercom system. Extras for your entertainment include five themed wallpapers, five games and a colour screen. The BT Equinox is available from Comet and online.

WORTH KNOWING If you're playing a game on the phone and someone tries to call, it will drop you out of the game.

BT DIVERSE 6450 £90 A large handset makes this comfortable if you like to rest the phone between your chin and shoulder. It

has a Sim card reader and an answering machine vou can use from the handset or base station. Score 76%

#### PANASONIC

KX-TCD820 £100 This can double as a baby monitor. It also includes a computer link to download ringtones and wallpapers. Score 74%

the 22 phones tested this time (not quite a Best Buy) and costs just £30 from Argos. It has features such as texting and a colour illuminated display. There's a fuzzy dial search - enter a number and the screen shows stored numbers to pick from. It also has games. Score 63%
