Chilling performance and practicality are key to our testing. We took almost 59 million readings in order to bring you our results

Keep it chilled

We place 1kg, 500g and 250g gel packs, which simulate food, at various positions in the fridge and freezer. Using temperature probes linked to a computer outside the fridge-freezers, we measure how quickly the gel packs drop to the

e gel packs drop to the desired temperature. The



temperature remains inside the fridge and freezer.

Added extras

We check for things that can make a fridge-freezer more pleasant to use – for instance, whether the handle design makes for easy opening (fridge-freezer doors are sometimes sticky to open) and how quiet and free of vibration the fridge-freezer is.

As well as measuring the fridgefreezers' external dimensions, we measure the available space inside the fridge and freezer and calculate the capacity of any drinks dispenser and ice maker by filling them with water.

The way we were

We first tested fridge-freezers in 1972, reporting on just four models ranging from £57 to £140. The 70s was the decade when sales of fridge-freezers took off and, according to the British Frozen Food Federation, the 'product of the decade' was the Findus Crispy Pancake.

Cool customers

We take a fresh look at the latest fridge-freezers – and have a peek at the models of the future

Almost 1.5 million fridge-freezers were sold in the UK in 2006. And it's no wonder they're so popular when they save on space and are cheaper than buying a fridge and freezer separately. Some also come with handy extra features such as ice makers and humidity-controlled compartments to help keep foods fresh for longer.

We even had a quick look at a model that comes with a built-in TV – which isn't as bizarre an idea as you may first think. If you want to watch your favourite programmes while you cook, owning a fridge-freezer with a built-in TV means you won't have a television set taking up much-needed work-surface space.

Before you can choose from our latest test of 41 fridge-freezers, you have to decide what type will best suit your needs – freestanding, built in or side by side.

Freestanding fridge-freezers are the most common type. They are usually tall, sometimes up to two metres, and the fridge is often the top compartment as it's the one that's used the most.

Be prepared to pay extra for a choice of colour, at times up to £100 or more for a freestanding model Built-in models allow you to match your fridge-freezer to your kitchen décor. They are often smaller than freestanding models and are significantly more expensive. This is because they use different components and far fewer of them are made.

Side-by-side models – otherwise known as American style – are slowly gaining in popularity, as they offer more storage space than the other types and also look good. But at almost a metre in width, they are very broad, so check that your doorways are wide enough to fit one through before you buy.

As well as being available in different styles, fridge-freezers have moved on from the days when they were available in any colour you wanted as long as it was white. However, be prepared to pay extra for a choice of colour, at times up to £100 or more for a freestanding model.

Now you know about all the different types of fridge-freezer that are available to buy, read on to discover the results of our test.

Futuristic fridge-freezers

LG's latest model gives a whole new meaning to the term TV dinner

Not only will the £1,700 LG GRG227STBA store food, but it also features a built-in 15-inch colour TV, an FM radio and a connection for a DVD player or set-top box.

We took a quick look at these features and found the screen has a decent picture quality with a good viewing angle, so you get a clear view even if you're standing considerably to one side of the screen. However, it's only about 88cm from the ground – ideally it should be higher to make it more comfortable

to view – and you will need to spend £15 extra on a portable aerial for TV reception.

Maximum volume is quite loud – useful if you have a large, noisy kitchen – but you'll get some distortion if you turn the volume up high.

Not to be outdone, the Siemens KG39MT90 also comes with a built-in 15-inch TV, although it's more expensive at £2,500. For the ultimate high-tech fridge-freezer, the £5,000 Electrolux EN55700X offers a TV, internet access and more.

81% Miele KFN 8862 SD £650

The Miele KFN makes life easy. It's got a bottle rack, a shelf you can split in half to create more space underneath and easy-to-open doors. The freezer also comes with a guide to how long different types of frozen food last, and a memo dial that reminds you when you put the product in. Available from Boots, Comet, Iceland and John Lewis.

WE LIKE This Miele has one of the largest storage capacities on test.

81% Liebherr CNES 3666 £900

This is one of the few models on test more than two metres tall, and it's spacious inside – the fridge is bigger than the Best Buy Siemens (left). The Liebherr also stood out for its cooling performance and temperature stability. Available from Comet.

WE LIKE You can remove half of one fridge shelf so tall items, such as jugs, can be fitted in on the shelf below.

4 FREESTANDING

80% Samsung RL33S BNS £380

Although cooling times are a little longer than for the top three freestanding models, this good-value, frost-free Samsung is cheap and quiet to run. It also has a huge crisper drawer at the bottom of the fridge for storing fresh vegetables, but there's no fast-freeze feature. Available from Currys.

WE FOUND After a power cut, the freezer will maintain its temperature for 31 hours – saving food that would otherwise go off.

This Hotpoint's fridge was the quickest at chilling fresh food - it really impressed, beating the nextbest Liebherr (2) and Miele (3) by an hour. The Hotpoint also makes good use of its available space inside, with good storage features. Available from Comet, Currys and Iceland.

WE LIKE It comes with two handy ice-cube trays that fit neatly between the freezer drawers.

Although it's not the biggest inside, thanks to an intelligent design this LG is one of the best models on test for convenience. WORTH KNOWING This model is the most expensive to run – over ten years it will cost about £370 more than the Electrolux (29).



Overall, it's a very good allrounder, but fridge-cooling speed lets it down a little. Available from Currys. **WORTH KNOWING Like the other** Best Buy Samsung (4), this model works best at 18-38°C - but in our tests we found that it still works well outside this temperature range.

Good value for money, this Hotpoint is very quick at cooling and freezing, helping to preserve the quality of food. It also comes with a fast-freeze option and a digital display for easier temperature control. However, it isn't frost free, so you'll have to manually defrost about twice a year, and there's also less usable freezer space than for most other models on test. Available from Comet.

WE FOUND The Hotpoint comes with a very useful bottle cooler.

Most of the models on test have this feature and it's useful if you're freezing fresh foods quick freezing helps retain more nutrients and also preserves the texture of foods such as bread. Some models require you to switch fast-freeze on 24 hours before you put the fresh food in

look for

FROST FREE

Frost-free models are usually more expensive. However, if you buy a fridgefreezer that isn't frostfree, you will have to manually defrost the freezer approximately twice a year

WATER CONNECTIONS AND ICE MAKER

if you plumb the unit into the mains supply, these enable your fridge-freezer to make ice cubes, crushed ice and chilled water on demand. Usually found on side-by-side models, they can be removed if you find that you need more space in the fridge

™Which should you choose?

Best for making ice

electrolux ERL6296KK1, £1,099 The internal ice maker on this Electrolux (29) can make a total of 2.25kg of ice — the largest amount of any model on test — which it can dispense crushed or in cubes.



Best for long-lasting fresh foods

BOSCH KIN32A41 GB, £740 The humidity-controlled compartment in this Bosch (35) works better than the humidity-controlled compartments found in six of the models on test (7, 10, 28, 32, 35, 37). The humidity-control compartment in the Whirlpool (10) worked particularly poorly in our tests.

Best for easy opening

MIELE KFN 8862 SD, £650 Owing to internal pressure and insulation, some fridge-freezer doors need a good tug to open them. If you sometimes have trouble opening doors, this Miele (3) is the one to go for.



Budget buy

LG GR359SQ, £300 Our cheapest Best Buy, the Samsung RL33SBSW (6), is £350 but if you can't quite stretch to that, this LG (12) is a great choice – particularly as LG scores above average for fridge-freezer reliability.
