Warming glow

Our test of 25 kettles – and one revolutionary water heater – reveals ten Best Buys, some with positively glowing reviews

It must be hard being a kettle designer. Over the decades they've been charged with quenching our national thirst for hot beverages with quick, efficient and stylish products.

Twenty years ago they came up with the cordless kettle, then a base with 360-degree rotation. The classic dome kettle evolved into the upright jug kettle, and, logically, the handle moved further from the spout. Now most kettles have reached the maximum power you can get from a mains appliance – that's about 3kW. Choosing your kettle has become a tricky business – should you go for an inbuilt water filter or will the usual limescale filter do? How about soft-touch handles, cool walls or a concealed element?

And just when you thought kettles had reached the limits of ingenuity, manufacturers are putting LED lights in them, hoping we'll be seduced by the warming blue, green or red glow into buying a kettle that will make a statement on our worktop.

But should you follow fashion, or go for a traditional kettle? At the end of the day, surely all we want it to do is boil water...fast? We've tested 25 kettles from all the major brands – including a £100 Porsche designer model (19, see table p70), which was let down by speed of boiling. Twenty one of the kettles we tested have matching toasters (see p64 for our toasters report) but only one pair is good enough for both to be matching Best Buys.

Our top Best Buy – the Russell Hobbs Ceylon – costs a modest £20. And on average, our ten Best Buys cost less than £35 – proving you can still find a decent fastboiling kettle on a tight budget.





We boil enough water for 750 cups of tea, and also check how easy each kettle is to lift, fill, carry, pour and clean.

We fill each kettle with a litre of water at 15°C and place a temperature probe in the centre. We record how long it takes to boil, how long it boils for before it automatically switches itself off – to calculate energy wasted – and the temperature at which it switches off. We do this three times to find the average boiling time and temperature, and we repeat the test for the minimum volume each kettle can safely boil.



84% Russell Hobbs Ceylon **13355** £20

We are impressed with this kettle's no-frills solidity. It takes only 147 seconds to boil a litre and then switches off in three seconds, so it

wastes minimal energy. It's incredibly easy to use – you can fill it via the spout – but doesn't have a water gauge. The fine nylon mesh limescale filter fits well. Cheapest at Argos, Currys and Tesco. **WE FOUND As with most stainlesssteel kettles, fingermarks show up.**

83% De'Longhi Argento KBR3015 £40

This rocket-shaped kettle is fast to boil, at 142 seconds for a litre, and is one of the lightest we tested. The filter works reasonably well, and is easy to remove and clean. You fill it either by lifting off the tight-fitting lid or through the spout. It's cheapest at Argos.

WE FOUND The handle is cramped if you have large hands.

83% Magimix 11565 £70

If you're dying for a cuppa, this boils a litre in an impressive 142 seconds. And it takes only 50 seconds to boil 250ml, a mugful. The limescale filter works well. The kettle feels solid and oozes

quality – the lid glides open when you push the button. But it is quite heavy. It's cheapest at Comet, Debenhams, House of Fraser and John Lewis.



WE LIKE There's a matching Best Buy two-slice toaster (see p65).

ON TEST KETTLES



80% Bellini BEJ50 £25

This kettle boils a litre of water fast, in 139 seconds, although the minimum – 550ml, or about two cups – took a slow 87 seconds. The limescale filter's fine nylon mesh fits and works well but is quite difficult to refit. The wide lid is easy to open by mistake. There are clear water gauges on both sides but the sculpted soft-grip handle obscures the power indicator. It's exclusive to Currys. **WORTH KNOWING It comes with a two-year guarantee.**

80% Morphy Richards Complements Graphite 43596 £20

This plastic kettle shouldn't show finger marks and is light, easy to carry and well balanced when pouring. You can fill it through the lid or spout and it's got an illuminated water gauge. It's exclusive to Argos, but you can get in other colours elsewhere.

WE FOUND It whistles when it boils but you can turn this off if you prefer.

79% Breville Blue Ice JK147 £40

With its striking clear plastic body, this Breville has a high-tech look. It boils 200ml



high-tech look. It boils 200ml (about a cupful) in only 48 seconds, leaving you little time to enjoy the blue illuminated handle and power switch. The stainless-steel mesh filter is hard to remove and replace. It's priced the same at Argos and John Lewis. **WE FOUND It's well balanced and very easy to fill and carry.**

78% Breville Spectra JK130 £35

Living up to its colourful name, the Spectra cycles through colours on standby and glows red when it boils.

Of the kettles we tested, it's the fastest at boiling a litre. It's comfortable, light, and easy to fill through the spout or lid, but refitting the filter can be tricky. Cheapest at Argos, Currys and Comet. WORTH KNOWING The light uses only 1W of power, so a year on continuous standby costs less than £1.

78% Cookworks Signature Silver Illuminated £15 This plastic kettle

This plastic kettle offers designer

touches on a tight budget. It boils a litre in 148 seconds and is easy to clean, and the nylon filter works well.

We liked the clear window and volume markings. Exclusive to Argos. WORTH KNOWING A similar model in white costs £13 at Argos.

Tefal Quick Cup

The Cambridge English Dictionary defines a kettle as 'a covered metal or plastic container...used for boiling water'. So, on that basis, the Tefal QuickCup, £60, is no kettle. To be fair, while Tefal makes bold claims, it does stop short of saying its water heater boils water. That's why we can't directly compare it with the kettles in our main test.

Although we found that it started to give 'hot water in three seconds', filling our 250ml mug took 21. The pump was noisy throughout – far more than any kettle we tested. And the average water temperature was 94.2°C – ideal for coffee or other hot drinks, but experts say tea tastes best when made with boiling water.

You can program the Quick Cup to remember how much water your favourite mug holds and you'll just heat the water you need, so saving electricity. You can fill the 1.5 litre detachable water tank from the tap and it can filter water using a Claris filter, which lasts a month.





76% Krups Teastyle FLB295 945

The Krups boils a litre in 142 seconds. The gauge starts partway up the kettle and is blocked by the chunky handle. And the



minimum-fill mark on the gauge we found was equivalent to 1.35 litres. Apart from this, it's a fine kettle – fast and easy to use – and the limescale filter works well. It's a shame that the shiny body gets smeared easily. You can buy it from John Lewis.

WE FOUND The power lead is a metre long, but it can be stored in the base if your socket is closer.

74% Russell **Hobbs Classic Satin Montana 3070** £25

This kettle has stood the test of time since we first tested it in January 2006. It's energy efficient and quick to boil, taking 146 seconds for 1 litre. On the downside, it's very noisy and feels unbalanced, and the handle is too small for large hands. The lid needs a gripping action to remove it, which may be a problem if you have limited dexterity. It's cheapest at John Lewis. WORTH KNOWING A similar model is available in black or polished stainless steel at Argos.

OUR RESEARCH

When selecting kettles to test, we consult manufacturers, market intelligence reports and industry experts, then check availability on the high street and online. Models tested include top-sellers from the most popular brands, products with innovative features, models from some lesser-known brands and widely available Best Buys from previous tests. We also try to test both kettles and toasters from the same manufacturers' ranges.

USING THE TABLE

The more stars the better.

Specification

Price For Best Buys we give the cheapest widely available highstreet price. Prices for other models are a guide. **Capacity** The maximum volume of water you can boil – as claimed by the manufacturer. **Empty weight** Without the power base. **Colour** AL=aluminium; SSB=brushed stainless steel; SSP=polished stainless steel. Other colours are plastic unless stated. **Matching toaster** indicates that the kettle is part of a range that includes a matching toaster. See our toasters report on p64.

Test performance

Time to boil Based on the average boiling time for a litre of water, ranging from 137 seconds (★★★★★) to 205 seconds (★★). Energy to boil Based on how much energy the kettle uses to boil a litre of water. Ease of use This includes general ease of use, the comfort of the handle for lifting and pouring, the balance of the kettle when full and empty, and the visibility of controls and water gauges. Surface cleaning How easy it is to remove stains from the outside of the kettle. Limescale filter How well the filter catches scale, how well it fits, and durability. Noise How noisy the kettle is when it is boiling a litre of water.
