# Smell a bargain

You can pay more than £3 for a kitchen cleaner, but don't. Cheaper options are just as good – including soap and water

It's the weekend and time to give the kitchen a good scrub. Trouble is there are so many cleaners on sale, it can be hard to know which to choose. All the cleaners on test performed well, so the biggest differences are in price, value and smell.

Avoid the Ozkleen Kitchen Power as it is by far the most expensive at £3.68 -£2.90 more than our cheapest Best Buy.

You should get good value for money from the two Sainsbury's sprays. These are likely to last you longest as we had to use less of them to clean up than any other sprays. Sainsbury's Kitchen Cleaner was the second cheapest Best Buy and is our best-value option. It does have a bleachy smell, though, and you may prefer to use a spray that has a more pleasant aroma.

In last month's plughole unblockers test, Mr Muscle gave us a Best Buy and a worst-performing product. The same is true here. Mr Muscle Orange Wipes aren't bad at cleaning but are bottom of the table when value for money is taken into account. Kitchen wipes in general are effective cleaners but terrible value when compared with sprays.

This came top overall for its performance, value for money and smell. But there's no clear list of surfaces you can and can't use it on – just a warning not to use it on damaged surfaces. WE LIKE It leaves your kitchen

smelling minty fresh.

# 88% Sainsbury's Kitchen Cleaner 79p

This is the best-value spray on test. We had to use less of the two Sainsbury's sprays than any others and

this is the second cheapest Best Buy too. The smell isn't pleasant, though. WE'RE NOT KEEN ON Bleachy odour.

# **Cleaning the** traditional way

Soap and water, vinegar, soda crystals - do they really work?

The cleaners we've tested are convenient, but traditional methods offer cheap alternatives which often do the job as well if not better (see Which?, March 2005, p24).

Warm water and a little washingup liquid usually take care of kitchen worktops. Traditional soda crystals are great for shifting greasy stains on stainless-steel sinks and cooker hobs. Lemon juice removes limescale from chrome taps, or mix it with a little salt (three parts salt to one part lemon juice) to clean copper and brass. Vinegar is good for cleaning glass - it's a traditional method for cleaning windows. Dilute one part vinegar to nine parts water and it works on glass cupboard doors and placemats, too. Bicarbonate of soda mixed into a paste with a little water usually shifts most splashes and spills from tiles and enamelled surfaces (such as fridges, freezers and microwaves).

Curry splashes, tea bags and Ribena help our tests We look at what the manufacturer claims the product does and also check the instructions are clear. Then we pull on our Marigolds and get down to some serious cleaning.

We test each product on six different surfaces: a white laminate worktop, a cooker hob, kitchen tiles, a stainless steel sink, cupboard doors and glass. We rate ease and speed of cleaning, how easy it is to polish off the job and how good the surface looks afterwards.

The stains differ for each surface. On the worktop we tackle curry, undiluted Ribena, lily pollen and two types of tea stain – a used tea bag and a teacup ring stain. We caked the cooker hob in pasta water and animal

fat - both frequent spills. The kitchen tiles see curry splashes, hard water stains and lard. Other surfaces suffer typical splashes and stains from food, fat and fingermarks to old dishwater. For each cleaner, we note how much is used to achieve the desired result to calculate value for money and note which cleaners leave the best smell.

## **General warnings**

Some cleaners warn about surfaces they shouldn't be used on. If in doubt, test on an inconspicuous area first. If you have bespoke kitchen surfaces such as marble or solid wood, the supplier should be able to advise on what products to use.

This removes stains quickly and has instructions that are OK, though not as good as some. Similarly, it's not as sweet smelling as our top-scoring cleaner but it doesn't smell bad.

# 89% Flash Spray with Bleach £1.09

The Flash Spray lists the surfaces it will clean and gives clear guidance about what to avoid, such as damaged surfaces and aluminium. The smell of bleach is strong but if you don't mind that, it's worth trying. WE LIKE The clear instructions.

## 86% Asda Lemon **Fresh Multi-surface Cleaner** £1.00

This claims to be 'lemon fresh' but you'll need a strong sense of smell to pick up the scent. It does a good job across the board, though. WE LIKE The big (750ml) bottle. Cheapest store Asda Bottle size 750ml



# 85% Asda Lemon **Fresh Kitchen Cleaner** 78p

A good cleaner, but not the best on smell. The long list of surfaces you shouldn't use it on include wood and worn surfaces. Available at Asda. WORTH KNOWING Contains bleach. Cheapest store Asda Bottle size 500ml
