Hamster alert

Using it as bedding for a rabbit may be fine but it's not suitable for small animals such as hamsters. This is because there can be staples in it and some of the print may be toxic if a hamster eats it or carries it around in its pouches. JEMMA SHARROCK, CREWE WHICH? SAYS Thanks. The

RSPCA confirms this. Unless you're sure the paper contains non-toxic ink and is staple-free, don't use it for hamsters and other small rodents. It should be OK for rabbits.
