CORRECTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

Hobs, Oct 06, p61

The dimensions of the Best Buy Whirlpool AKM441 gas on glass hob (11 in the table, p63) are 68x51cm.

Wind turbines, Jan 07, p6

The correct abbreviation for kilowatt hours is kWh.

Making a will, Feb 07, p26

Under Scottish law only one witness is normally required to validate a will ('Checklist', p27). But even with no witnesses, a Scottish will may still be valid. Check with a solicitor who practises under Scottish law.

School uniforms

The Bury Grammar School Girls' white blouse ('High street vs specialists', p35) costs £10.50.

Digital radios, Feb 07, p56

The weights of the pocket radios in the table should have had the decimal point one place to the left. So, for example, the Pure Pocket DAB 2000 Best Buy is 0.2kg rather than 2.0kg.

Cordless drills, Feb 07, p61

The recommended price of the Best Buy Makita 8444

DWDE3 (1 in the table, p62) is £340 but you can buy it online for around £235. The Bosch PSR 18 VE-2 (9 in the table) weighs 2.1kg and has two gears with speeds of 400/1,250rpm.
