### Dishwashers, March 07, p50

For the Beko DWD4310W and DE2431FS (14 & 18 in the table, p52) we tested the Economy 50°C program as the main program and the Rapid 35°C program for the eco program.

### DIY strippers, March 07, p56

The total test score for two of the heat guns was incorrect. The total test score for the Black & Decker KX2000K (1 in the table, p57) is 88 per cent,

and the total test score for the DeWalt DW340K (2) is 90 per cent. The DeWalt DW340K should have five stars for both performance and ease of use. Both products are still Best Buys.

### Televisions, Apr 07, p38

The crossed-out wheelee bin sign ('Dispose of properly', p41) indicates that the product shouldn't be put in with normal household waste.
