Parking Mad, Which?: Your guide to consumer rights

The advice on p18-19 of this booklet, which was sent out with the April 2007 issue of *Which?*, applies only to appeals against penalty charge notice (PCN) parking tickets. For advice on challenging other types of parking ticket, see 'Your rights', *Which?*, January 2006, p73. The Parking and Traffic Appeals Service hears appeals about PCN tickets issued only in London. Elsewhere in England and Wales, contact the National Parking Adjudication Service. In Scotland, appeal to the Scottish Parking Appeals Service. In Northern Ireland, you can appeal to an independent adjudicator via the Roads Service.

Getting rid of pests

The bottom middle image on the cover shows a gerbil, not a mouse. We don't think, of course, that gerbils, which can make great pets, are 'unwelcome guests'. The cockroach shown on p18 is a Madagascan Hissing cockroach, not the Oriental or German cockroach common to the UK.

Child car seats

June 2007, p70

We incorrectly said that the Mamas & Papas Pro-Tour uses an adult seat belt to restrain a 9kg child ('Don't Buys', p70). In fact, it has a separate harness for Group 1 (9-18kg) children. However, we still don't recommend it, as the instructions say you

must remove the backrest (thus turning it into a booster cushion) for children over 22kg, and in this configuration it provides no protection from side impacts.
